County TB Seal Sale \$500 From Goal; All Returns Welcome Though Delayed

Continuing reports in the week. The division is expected to meet its \$1,000 goal for the county tuberculosis association.

Assuming that the Negro division has raised \$1,000 in the 1952 sale, the county total early this week stood at \$7,020, only \$480 short of the goal, Johnson said.

Aberdeen's total was reported early this week by C. M. Wilson Jr., chairman, as \$1,060.15 which is \$39.85 short of the \$1,100 local

Notice of City License Tags

This is to remind you that you may now obtain your Motor Vehicle License Plates for 1953 from the Office of the Town Clerk of Southern Pines. Every resident owner of a motor vehicle operated in the Town, except motor vehicles temporarily operated for a period of time not exceeding a total of thirty (30) days, and except motor vehicles operated for car display or car exhibition purposes by car manufacturers or dealers, displaying dealer's license plates issued by the State of North Carolina, shall register such vehicle with the Town Registrar of Motor Vehicles, at the Office of the Town Clerk.

Every motor vehicle operated on the streets of the Town for which registration is required, shall throughout the current year display the assigned Town number plate in such manner in front or rear as to be visible at all times.

The fee for registration and number plate is One (\$1.00) Dollar, not prorated.
