Cotton Classing By Farmers Urged

Cotton planting time is close a hand for farmers. So, the U.S. Department of Agriculture urges cotton growers to get their applications in early this year for the free cotton classing and market news services offered under the Smith-Doxey Act.

Farmers can apply for USDA's services in the same way as in the past years. Any group of producers is eligible for the Smith-Doxey services if organized to promote the improvement of cotton.
