
# **Nephew Of Local** Residents Killed In Navy Tragedy

Orlo Hamlin Kane, 24, Navy lieutenant junior grade who was a nephew of Mrs. Howard Butler and Mrs. Al Wells, of Southern Pines, was killed in the violent explosion and fire on the Aircraft Carrier Bennington 75 miles off the New England coast Wednes-

The young man had visited in Southern Pines periodically since he was a child. His wife, the former Virginia Lee Brasse of Alexandria, Va., and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Evan O'Neill Kane of Kane, Pa., visited here two weeks

Lieutenant Kane was a graduate of Mercersburg Academy and

Lafayette College, Easton, Pa. Some 90 Navy personnel were killed in the tragedy and more than 200 were injured.
