300 Graduating In Moore County

Seniors Receiving Diplomas As Finals Programs Are Held

Nearly three hundred students will receive their diplomas at high school graduation exercises in Moore county this year.

The commencement exercises started last Thursday at the Carthage high school when the seniors presented their annual class night. The baccalaureate sermon will be delivered on Sunday evening, May 30, in the high school auditorium by the Rev. O. J. Hagler, pastor of the Carthage Baptist church. On Tuesday evening, June 1, the graduation exercises will be held.

Commencement exercises began in the Pinehurst high school Tuesday evening when the seniors gave their class play in the school auditorium. The baccalaureate sermon will take place on Sunday evening, May 30, at eight o'clock in the school auditorium and will be delivered by Dr. Bernard Boyd of the University of North Carolina.

Farm Life will begin its commencement program on Friday evening, May 28, with the annual music recital which will be held in the school auditorium at 8 o'clock. The baccalaureate sermon will be delivered on Sunday evening, May 30, at 8 o'clock. Class night will be observed on Tuesday evening, June 1, and graduation exercises held on Wednesday, June 2.

The commencement program at Robbins began on Sunday night, May 23, with the annual baccalaureate sermon which was delivered by the Rev. J. C. Meigs of Polkton and was held in the

grammar school auditorium. Graduation exercises will be Friday night, May 28, with I. G. Greer as the speaker.

The graduation exercises began at Aberdeen on Sunday, May 23, when the baccalaureate sermon was preached in the Page Memorial Methodist church with the Rev. C. W. Worth delivering the message. Class night took place on Thursday evening, May 27, in the high school gymnasium. The graduation exercises will be held on May 31 in the school gymnasium at 8 o'clock.
