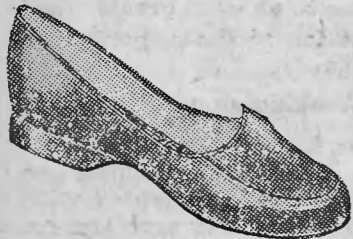


Carthage Rotary Has Event For Dairy Farmers
