

### Robeson County Home Clubs Cooperate In Setting Up Guest Wing At Hospital

An achievement by cooperative working of Home Demonstration clubs of Robeson County resulted in the opening, in May, of a guest wing of the State Cancer Institute.

When the patients' relatives come to visit, these visitors have been put to a great deal of inconvenience because the Institute, a nursing home, is at a distance from Lumberton; the visitors frequently go to great sacrifice to make the trip to the institute and the financial burden of a stay is great.

A spokesman for the Home Demonstration Clubs said, "It seemed only right since the Cancer Institute is in Robeson County that women of the county should provide shelter for those who came to visit loved ones."

The nursing home is financed by the State Division of the American Cancer Society and County Welfare Departments, with the help of many county cancer units of the Society, but this program of providing hospitality presented a challenge to Robesonians.

One wing of the building, leased to the Institute but not in use, was chosen for the project. The renovation presented a real challenge to the Home Demonstration Clubs, but the clubs of all races—White, Negro, and Indian—accepted the challenge and set to work to prepare a certain number of suites of rooms for each race.

Many years ago the building was used for the County Home and the rooms of the building were cluttered with odds and ends of old furniture, beds, dressers,

shelves, and closets. Rolling up their sleeves, the women went to work. The White clubs took over their portion and determined to set up three bedrooms, a bathroom, and a kitchenette; a reception room was also in the plans. The Negro and Indian clubs each settled on a reception room, two bedrooms, and a bath.

A general fund from the three races representing these clubs supplied money for necessary renovation and decoration and for plumbing and electrical wiring. Linen showers were announced and all necessary items were supplied in generous amounts. A hot plate and shelves for china and a few pots and pans were installed. With this equipment it will be possible for over-night guests to prepare breakfast and thus be enabled to make a longer visit with their loved ones.

The first week of May was National Home Demonstration Week and how better could it have been observed than by completing their project of providing a comfortable and cheerful home, away from home, for people with very ill loved ones?

With Mrs. Jack Oliver as chairman for this project, the working committee includes Miss Hilda Clontz, Miss Mary Jane Gresham,

Mrs. Helen Sampson, Miss Mollie Hughes, Mrs. Alma Bacote and Miss Rosa Worley, home demonstration staffs for the three club groups.

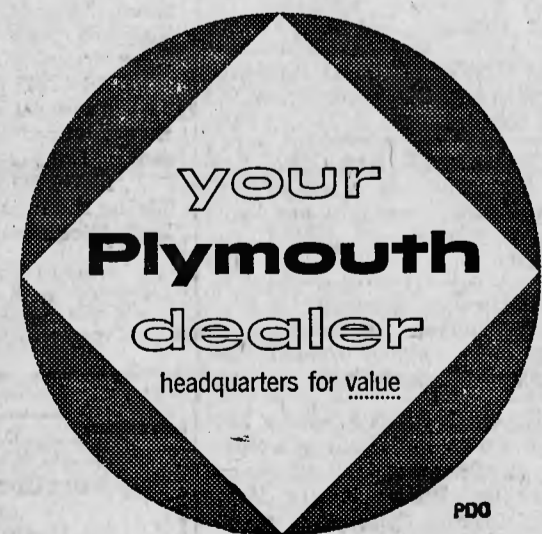
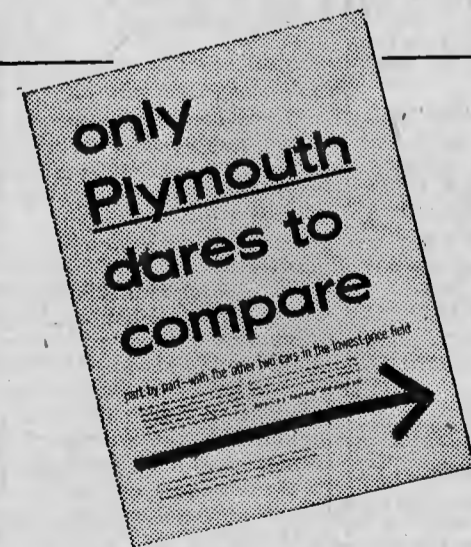
