

### 14 Paintings By Japanese Students Now At Library

Fourteen paintings by Japanese high school students are on display in the art gallery of the Southern Pines Library, to remain there until further notice. The paintings were obtained for exhibition from the State Art Gallery at Raleigh, to which they were sent last year by the chief of the board of education in the Japanese province of Wakoyama to help introduce Japanese civilization to the American people. The paintings were shown first

at Raleigh and are now available for exhibition in galleries, schools, libraries and other responsible institutions of the State.

The 14 pictures include oil paintings, watercolors, and prints and cover a variety of subjects — one portrait in watercolor, three seaside scenes, an inland landscape and several decorative subjects.

The Japanese exhibition, expected to last several weeks, is a variation from the shows, mostly by local artists and lasting two weeks each, that have been held continuously at the library gallery since last summer. Further plans for the library gallery will be announced later in the summer.

## THEATRES CAROLINA

There are still three days left of M-G-M's masterly musical comedy, "Student Prince" in CinemaScope, Stereophonic Sound and beautiful Anasco Color at the Carolina Theatre this Thursday, Friday and Saturday, June 24-26, at 8:15 p. m., with a Saturday matinee at 3.

The superb singing by the "invisible" star, Mario Lanza, whose recording of the songs by the Student Prince are used, the delightful Sigmund Romberg music, the spectacular sequences and some especially fine and appealing acting make this production an audience "natural."

Such happiness, such soul-stirring love songs, such rapture of carefree student days are beautiful to hear and behold.

Ann Blyth is the barmaid; Edmund Purdom, handsome young star, is the prince. He kisses with his own lips but sings with the glorious voice of Mario Lanza.

Patrons will be enthralled by the immortal music and by the panoramic sweep of the plot on the CinemaScope screen.

A taut, exciting melodrama about the intrigue that goes on almost every day between East and West Berlin and the powder-keg for danger it represents, comes to the Carolina Theatre the entire week of June 27 at 8:15 p. m., with matinee Sunday, Tuesday and Saturday at 3 p. m.

It is the CinemaScope production with Stereophonic Sound and Technicolor, "Night People," with Gregory Peck, Broderick Crawford, Anita Bjork, and Rita Gam who, with a large supporting cast and complete production unit, went to Germany where the entire picture was filmed.

Played in the actual locale of the story and with such outstanding landmarks as the Brandenburg Gate, Under Den Linden, the burned out Reichstag Building, the bunker in the Chancellery where Hitler and Eva Braun met their deaths, the fire-gutted Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church, and street scenes along Berlin's most fashionable street, Kurfurstendamm.

The tense story revolves around the intrigues that ensue when a young American corporal is kidnapped from the western zone by the Russians, who seek to exchange the young man for a wanted elderly German couple.

Fine performances are turned in by the entire cast, but the outstanding one is delivered by Gregory Peck as a dynamic American colonel in counter-intelligence who despises political red-tape and influence and who outwits the Russians at their own game in negotiating the return of the kidnapped soldier.

True, CinemaScope and Technicolor add to the feature's excellence but the subject's mainstays are a solid story, abounding in spine-tingling suspense; superlative performances by a hand-picked cast; and authentic mountings.

It reflects a triple triumph for Nunnally Johnson, who scripted, produced and directed it, and rates as one of the most lavishly praised films of this or any other year.
