

Charges Against Two Young Men Are Non-Suited, Except Trespass Count

Man Claimed Ring Was On Television Set When Removed

Charges of breaking and entering and larceny against two young men—Frank Johnson 19, of Carthage, Route 2, and William Higgins, 20, of Carthage—were non-suited in recorders court Monday by Judge J. Vance Rowe, but Johnson was found guilty of trespass and Higgins of aiding and abetting in this offense.

For each, judgment was continued on payment of the costs. Judge Rowe said he had made punishment light "because the court is satisfied the defendants had not wilfully committed any offense, but did what their employer had told them to do."

What they had been told to do was to repossess a television set from the home of Henry Garner. After they had entered the home and taken out the set, Garner indicted them for breaking and entering and larceny, claiming that a ring valued at \$84 had been on the television set before it was removed, and subsequently could not be found.

The young men testified that they knew nothing about such a ring and the original charges were non-suited by Judge Rowe. During the testimony, it became evident, however, that they entered the Garner home without proper claim and delivery papers for the television set and judge Rowe ordered the warrant amended to charge trespass.

Liquor, Speeding Charged

Dola Futch Manway, 45-year-old Cameron, Route 1, woman, was sentenced to six months in the women's division of State prison on charges of speeding 70 miles per hour, possession of illicit whiskey, transporting whiskey and having no horn on the car she was driving.

She had pled not guilty to all except the speeding charge but was found guilty on all counts. Judge Rowe allowed a suspended sentence, on payment of \$50 fine and the costs and on condition of good behavior for two years, during which she is to remain under supervision of the State probation officer. The defendant appealed the judgment to Superior Court, but later withdrew the appeal and paid the fine and costs.

Highway Patrol Corporal M. S. Parvin of near Carthage said that two men had thrown one-half gallon jars of whiskey from the car and had jumped out and that he had chased and arrested the defendant who had driven off in the car.
