## Barbecue Planned After Democratic Event At Sanford

Congressman Charles B. Deane of the Eighth N. C. Congressional District this week announced further plans for the 1954 Eighth District Democratic rally to be held at the Lee County Courthouse in Sanford on Tuesday, October 12, at 2 p. m.

Mr. Deane and the new State Democratic Chairman John D. Larkins, Jr., have worked out an interesting program for the rally which is expected to officially launch the Democratic fall campaign in the 12 counties of the Eighth District, Anson, Davidson, Davie, Hoke, Lee, Montgomery, Moore, Richmond, Scotland, Union, Wilkes and Yadkin.

The Sanford rally will be one of the 12 Congressional rallies sponsored during the 1954 fall campaign by the State Democratic Executive Committee throughout the State. The Sanford event will feature talks by the Democratic leaders of the State including the State Chairman and the Democratic nominees for the two United States Senate posts and for State offices. Governor Umstead is expected to attend and address the gathering.

Mr. Deane has notified the Democratic chairman in each county of the District concerning the plans for the Sanford rally and has urged each of them to see that a large delegation of Democratic leaders and workers come to this event. W. Lamont Brown of Southern Pines, Moore Democratic chairman, has urged attendance by party members in this county.

The Lee County Democratic Executive Committee, with Ralph Monger, Jr., of Sanford as chairman, will act as the host for the rally and will see that all in attendance have a successful time. Plans are underway for a barbecue to follow the rally.
