

## Re-Signing of Speed Zones On Highway Explained By N. C. Traffic Engineer

**Drivers Must Now Comply With Exact Speed Designated**

An extensive re-signing of the State's speed zones on paved primary highways and secondary roads in rural areas is nearing completion, Traffic Engineer Robert Burch reports.

More than 1,000 speed zone locations have been studied and reclassified. A thorough engineering investigation was made on the location of each speed zone. As a result, a total of 15,000 posts and signs have been erected across the State.

"To maintain a free flow of traffic, we did away with many unnecessary and obsolete speed zones. We wanted to be fair to the through motorist and not impose any undue restriction. Some zones were abolished, others were increased, some reduced and many new ones were put in after our engineering survey," he said.

Burch stressed that the speed zones mean just what they say. "We've tried to post the speed zones with the maximum safe driving speed. Our new signs have taken out the former tolerance. Instead of posting a 25 mph sign and hoping that a driver will slow down to 30 or 35 mph which might be the true safe maximum speed, we've posted such an area with a 35 mph sign which means 35 and no higher. The new signs make no allowance for the driver who merely slows down and doesn't comply with the exact posted speed. The wise driver will go no faster than the signs indicate."

Motorists are urged by Burch to cooperate by observing the speed zones. He emphasized that the speed zones have a definite reason for being there based on a thorough engineering survey. "Please observe the signs," he said, "when driving through a restricted speed zone. Watch driveway entrances, intersections, and especially pedestrians. That way, the area will be safe for other highway users as well as the through motorist."

Two new signs have been added to speed zones, one at its beginning, the other at its end. The old "Speed Zone Ahead" has been replaced by a new "Reduce Speed Ahead" which must be posted 600 feet in advance of a

The other new sign, "Resume Safe Speed," is posted at the end of the speed zone. It replaces the old "End of Speed Zone" which is still widely used in many states. Critics say "End of Speed Zone" is so worded to encourage a driver so worded to encourage a driver to suddenly speed up and to think he can go as fast as he likes. The new "Resume Safe Speed" satisfies such complaints, signals the driver he has left restricted speed area, and yet doesn't imply that he should speed to excess.

A well-traveled portion of highway in Moore County on which the signs have been changed is No. 1 through Aberdeen where the speed limit has been increased from 35 to 45 miles per hour.
