

**Game Laws To Be Strictly Enforced**

The state's wildlife protectors—153 of them—have received orders to "crack down" on hunting violations with special emphasis on hunting without licenses.

Walter Anderson, chief of the Wildlife Resources Commission's Wildlife Protection Division, said that hunting or fishing without proper license is by far the most frequent violation of the fishing and hunting rules. Incidence of violations has been high thus far in the season.

"Although emphasis will be placed on persons hunting or fishing without license, such violations as unplugged shotguns, exceeding bag limits, and out-of-season hunting will not be overlooked. Copies of the official regulations have been distributed to license dealers throughout the state and are available to license buyers. No one will be excused for failure to be informed of the law."

**Success Won By Pembroke College Indian Graduates**

**Kiwanis, Rotary In Joint Meeting Hear Story of Institution**

North Carolina has a college for Indians of which it may well be proud. Students moving on to graduate schools in leading colleges of the country have been attaining higher marks than the average of students in these institutions, and are going on into important posts in the industrial and scientific world.

Members of the Sandhills Kiwanis Club and Southern Pines Rotary Club heard this story last week from Dr. W. D. Wellons, president of Pembroke State College for Indians, at Pembroke, in Robeson County. Dr. Wellons has headed the 68-year-old institution since 1942. He was presented to the club by J. B. Perkinson, president of the Rotary Club, at a joint meeting at the Southern Pines Country Club.

Dr. Wellons reviewed the history of Pembroke College, originally established as a Normal School for the Indians of Robeson County but now an institution drawing from wider areas. At the time it was founded, no acceptable schooling was available to the large Indian settlement of the county. Today, the college has an enrollment of 160, a capacity of 180 students, boys and girls. It offers a wide range of courses, leading to degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science. It is fully accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges, and holds membership in the Association of American Colleges.

"Boys and girls whose parents could not read or write have gone on from Pembroke to make marks in the world," Dr. Wellons told the club members. "And they have become useful citizens at home. A large portion of the land of Robeson county today is owned by Indians."

Accompanying Dr. Wellons to the meeting was the head of the college's Music department, Ira Pate Lowry, and two young ladies, one a graduate who sang two solos beautifully, another a student pianist whose renditions scored a big hit with the audience. Dr. Wellons invited the Kiwanians and Rotarians to visit Pembroke and become acquainted with their neighboring institution.
