

If you plan to grow spring flowering bulbs for several years, it pays to prepare the soil thoroughly and fertilize liberally. Use a fertilizer such as 8-8-8 at the rate of about four pints per 100 square feet. Mix the fertilizer thoroughly with the soil and make sure that some of the fertilizer is placed as deeply as the bulb is planted.
