NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCES

The Town Council of the Town of Southern Pines do enact ordinances at special session assembled this the 23rd day of November, 1955, as follows:

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$150,000 OF BONDS OF THE TOWN OF SOUTHERN PINES FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION, ENLARGEMENT AND EXTENSION OF THE WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM OF SAID TOWN.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Southern Pines as follows:

Section 1. The Town Council of the Town of Southern Pines has ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary that said Town reconstruct, enlarge and extend the water supply system maintained by said Town to provide a supply of water to said Town and its inhabitants, and acquire and install the equipment, machinery and apparatus suitable for and constituting a part of such reconstructed, enlarged and extended system, and acquire the lands or rights-in-land suitable therefor, and that it will be nec-

essary to expend for said purpose not less than \$150,000.

Section 2. Said Town Council has also ascertained and hereby determines that the purpose hereinbefore described is a necessary expense of said Town within the meaning of Section 7 of Article VII of the Constitution of North Carolina, and is a purpose for which said Town may raise or appropriate money, and is not a current expense of said Town.

Section 3. In order to raise the money required for such purpose, bonds of the Town of Southern Pines are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to The Municipal Finance Act, 1921, of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate amount of bonds authorized by this ordinance shall be One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000).

Section 4. A tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 5. A statement of the debt of said Town has been filed with the Town Clerk of said Town, as required by said Act, and is open to public inspection.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect when approved by the voters of said Town at an election to be called and held as provided in said Act.

The foregoing bond ordinance was passed on the 23rd day of November, 1955 and was first published on the 1st day of December, 1955.

Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$150,000 OF BONDS OF THE TOWN OF SOUTHERN PINES FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION, ENLARGEMENT AND EXTENSION OF THE SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM OF SAID TOWN.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Southern Pines as follows:

Section 1. The Town Council of the Town of Southern Pines has ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary that said Town reconstruct, enlarge and extend the sanitary sewer system maintained by said Town, including sewage disposal plants, and acquire and install the equipment, machinery and apparatus suitable for and constituting a part of such reconstructed, enlarged and extended system, and acquire the lands or rights-in-land suitable therefor, and that it will be necessary to expend for said purpose not less than \$150,000.

Section 2. Said Town Council has also ascertained and hereby determines that the purpose hereinbefore described is a necessary expense of said Town within the meaning of Section 7 of Article VII of the Constitution of North Carolina, and is a purpose for which said Town may raise or appropriate money, and is not a current expense of said Town.

Section 3. In order to raise the money required for such purpose, bonds of the Town of Southern Pines are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to The Municipal Finance Act, 1921, of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate amount of bonds authorized by this ordinance shall be One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000).

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$100,000 OF BONDS OF THE TOWN OF SOUTHERN PINES FOR THE ERECTION AND EQUIPMENT OF MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS FOR SAID TOWN.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of

Southern Pines as follows:

Section 1. The Town Council of the Town of Southern Pines has ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary that said Town erect one or more new buildings to be used by the Town as offices for the conduct of the government and affairs of the Town and for the housing and storage of its properties, and acquire the land and acquire and install the equipment suitable therefor, and that it will be necessary to expend for said purpose not less than \$100,000.

Section 2. Said Town Council has also ascertained and hereby determines that the purpose hereinbefore described is a necessary expense of said Town within the meaning of Section 7 of Article VII of the Constitution of North Carolina, and is a purpose for which said Town may raise or appropriate money, and is not a current expense of said Town.

Section 3. In order to raise the money required for such purpose, bonds of the Town of Southern Pines are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to The Municipal Finance Act, 1921, of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate amount of bonds authorized by this ordinance shall be One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000).

Section 4. A tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 5. A statement of the debt of said Town has been filed with the Town Clerk of said Town, as required by said Act, and is open to public inspection.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect when approved by the voters of said Town at an election to be called and held as provided in said Act.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$50,000 OF BONDS OF THE TOWN OF SOUTHERN PINES FOR THE ERECTION AND EQUIPMENT OF A NEW SWIMMING POOL FOR SAID TOWN.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Southern Pines as follows:

Section 1. The Town Council of the Town of Southern Pines has ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary that said Town construct a new swimming pool for public resort and recreation in the West Southern Pines area of said Town and acquire the land and acquire and install the equipment suitable therefor, and that it will be necessary to expend for said purpose

not less than \$50,000.

Section 2. Said Town Council has also ascertained and hereby determines that the purpose hereinbefore described is a purpose for which said Town may raise or appropriate money, and is not a current expense of said Town.

Section 3. In order to raise the money required for such purpose, bonds of the Town of Southern Pines are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to The Municipal Finance Act, 1921, of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate amount of bonds authorized by this ordinance shall be Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000).

Section 4. A tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 5. A statement of the debt of said Town has been filed with the Town Clerk of said Town, as required by said Act, and is open to public inspection.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect when approved by the voters of said Town at an election to be called and held as provided in said Act.

The foregoing bond ordinance was passed on the 23rd day of November, 1955 and was first published on the 1st day of December, 1955.
