

WHAT KITCHIN SAYS ABOUT MIXING RACES IN SCHOOLS

Paul Kitchin, candidate for the Democratic nomination for Congress from the Eighth District, repeatedly has stated his position on racial integration and the Southern Manifesto. Here is what he said to members of the PTA in his home town of Wadesboro:

"Racial integration in schools amounts to social integration of the races insofar as a child is concerned. That is because so much of a child's social life is connected with the school. And that is one of the principal reasons I am unalterably opposed to the Supreme Court's position; and so wholeheartedly in favor of the Southern Manifesto which my opponent declined to sign.

"I want equal, but separate, educational opportunities for the Negro. I want the Negro to improve his own social life with other Negroes. But I do not believe in racial integration on the social level; and I will forever fight any law or ruling which forces the white and Negro children to mix socially at schools and in school buses.

"And that is just exactly what racial integration in the public schools would do."
