

### Building Specialty Company Opens Retail Store Here

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF SOUTHERN PINES**  
Pursuant to authority contained

in Chapter 160, North Carolina General Statutes entitled, "Municipal Corporations" Sections 175 and 176, and by authority and under direction of the Town Council of the Town of Southern Pines, notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held at the Town Office at 8:00 o'clock P. M. on the 12th day of June, 1956, for the purpose of hearing any complaints of interested persons in connection with a proposed amendment to the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Southern

Pines; in case of protest against such change signed by twenty percent or more either of the area of the lots included in such proposed change or of those immediately adjacent in the rear thereof extending one hundred feet therefrom, or of those directly opposite thereto extending one hundred feet from the street frontage of such opposite lots, such amendment shall not become effective except by favorable vote of three-fourths of all the members of the legislative body of such municipality.

The provisions of said proposed amendment are as follows:

Be it ordained and established by the Town Council of the Town of Southern Pines at regular session assembled this the 12th day of June, 1956, as follows:

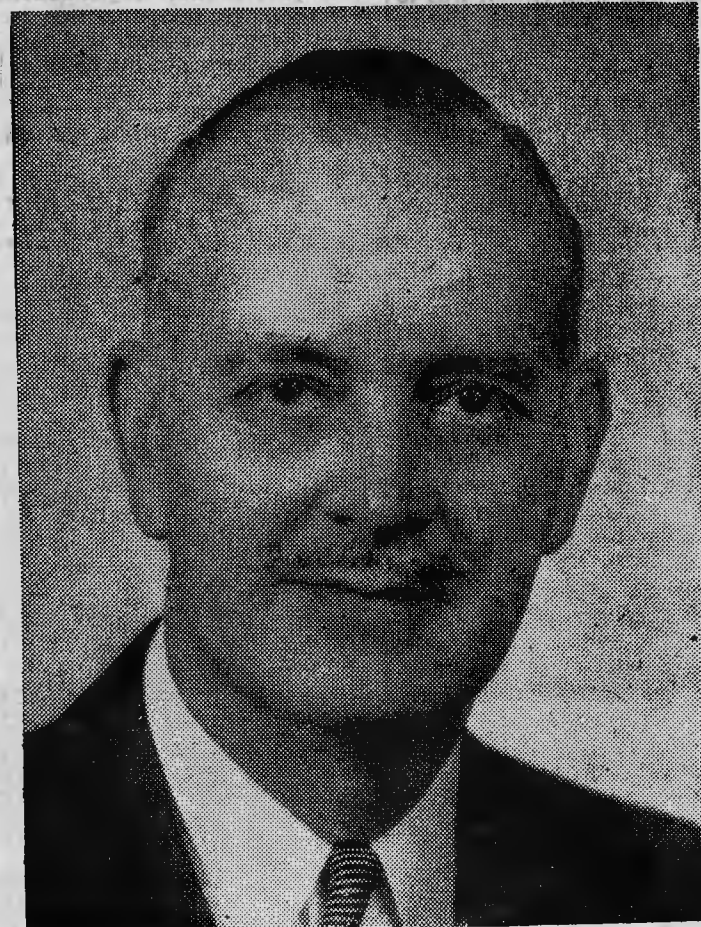
SECTION I. The Zoning Ordinance adopted by the Town Council January 12, 1954, as amended, be and is hereby further amended as follows:

Districts, E. Business II Districts, include and add a section to read as follows:

6. All of the block surrounded by S. W. Broad Street, West Illinois Avenue, Bennett Street, and West Massachusetts Avenue not already included in the B I Districts.

## WHAT KITCHIN SAYS ABOUT MIXING RACES IN SCHOOLS

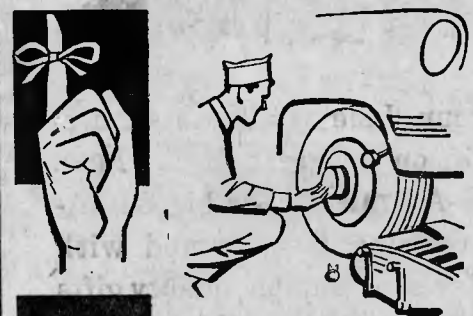
