He will return to Italy after completing the Specialist Course at Pope AFB.

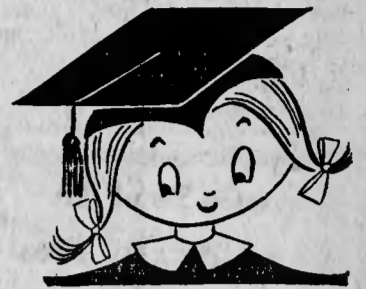

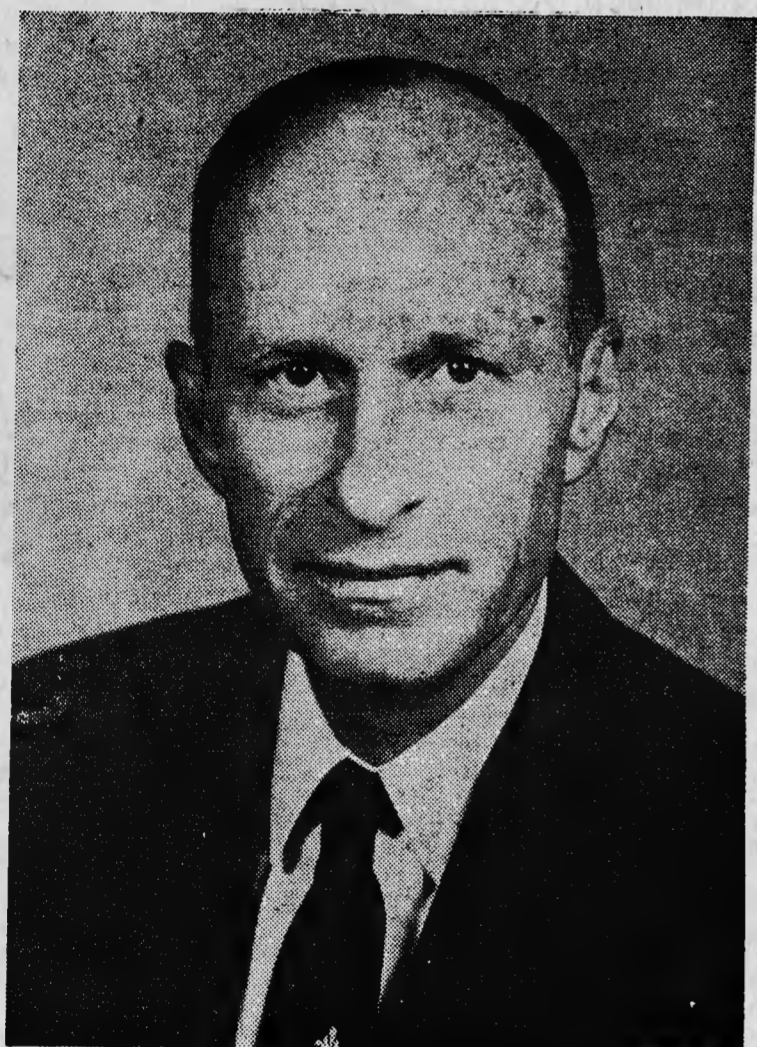
