Keller Completes Training On Soil Conservation Work

Willard K. Keller, specialist with the Moore County Soil Conservation Service, recently completed a five weeks refresher course at the Athens Training Center of the Soil Conservation Service.

The training unit is maintained on the campus of the University of Georgia where the facilities of the university and the nearby Watkinsville Agricultural Re-

search Station are used. The training center is operated by the U.S. Department of Agriculture for training new CSC employees and bringing old employees up to date on research information and new techniques. Seventeen SCS employees of the southeastern states from North Carolina to Arkansas, and two from Puerto Rico, attended the session.

Courses of study were given in the fields of soils, agronomy, agricultural engineering, forestry, wildlife, and human relations. The studies pointed toward the assistance that is given the farmer so that he may develop and apply a workable soil conservation program suited to the needs of his farm.

Courses were taught by mem pers of the U.S. Department of Agriculture and faculty members of the University.




