Included in the street department budget is \$5,000 for resurfacing a minimum of three miles of our existing paved street mileage system.

\$10,000 is included in this street department budget for the installation of approximately five blocks of curbing, gutter, and new pavement pursuant to the town's curb and gutter policy on existing streets.

Sewerage Department The personal services of this department is equivalent to approximately three man years of

During the current year, Sewer Department expenditures reached an all time high as the result of financing major sewer extentions and improvements necessitated by the installation of the new U. S. Highway No. 1 bypass. Needless to say, this is a nonrecurring expense.

Sewerage Department requirements for the coming year, consequently, are greatly reduced. Also included under this department is an item in the amount of \$2500 for the purchase of motorized sewer rodding equipment to reduce the costs of man power in the routine maintenance of sewer mains and the relieving of house sewer lateral stoppages.

Water Department Operating expenses during the coming year for the water department are up \$6500. \$2500 of this sum is attributable to the pay increase where approximately eight man years of personal service labor is employed.

The costs of personal services, supplies, and materials in this Department is more directly affected by high building activity than any other Department.

Principal and interest payments as a result of the issue of the water bonds May 1, 1956, will add an additional \$8138 to the Water Department expenses for the coming year. Recreation Department
