Coming this Friday and Saturday to the Carolina Theatre, for a return engagement in the Sandhills, is 'The Man Who Never Was' in CinemaScope and Technicolor, starring Clifton Webb, Gloria Grahame, Josephine Griffin and a long list of supporting players.
Based on Ewen Montagu's fabulous best-seller and filmed in England and Spain, it is one of the most amazing spy stories in the annals of naval intelligence, telling the true story of the daring plan developed by naval intelligence to divert German troops from Sicily so that Allied forces could invade the continent with as little resistance as possible.
And, added to the program, is the superbly photographed featurette, in CinemaScope and Eastman color, covering the wedding of Grace Kelly and Prince Rainier.
Produced by Citel Monaco with the cooperation of Compagnie Francaise de Films, it opens with magnificent aerial shots of the entire tiny country, then goes to Miss Kelly's arrival, the excitement of the townspeople and the civil and religious ceremonies, climaxed by the sailing of the honeymooners on the Prince's yacht.
Portions of two special ballet performances will interest the dance enthusiasts.
Coming Sunday through Wednesday, July 15-18, with three shows Sunday at 3, 7, and 9 p.m., and week nights at 8:15, is that hilarious comedy, 'That Certain Feeling,' in VistaVision and Technicolor, starring Bob Hope and Eva Marie Saint with George Sanders and Pearl Bailey.
It is a story full of that rare element called 'heart' which has figured in the fame and fortunes of every great comedy in screen history.
It is a tremendous 103 minutes of entertainment sure to send satisfied patrons out into the world intent upon sending friends, relatives and strangers into the theatre to share their satisfaction.
Directly opposite Hope are Eva Marie Saint, a surprise and a delight as a comedienne, George Sanders, and, a little below the title but on top of every minute she's on the screen, Pearl Bailey.
Equally indispensable to the flow of the story is eight-year-old Jerry Mathers, and, for a while, the key character is a whopping canine performer. (There are also four young persons named Linda, Tony, Nora and Kelly Hope, who make their first screen appearance in this production.)
