A total of 1,245 acres of forest land burned in Moore County in the six-month period ending June 30, it was reported today by Tra-

vis Wicker, county forest warden. Damage was placed at \$5,607.40, Wicker said, adding that the burned area was approximately .4 per cent of the total 307,904 acres of woodland in the county.

Wicker said that 80 per cent of the responsible parties starting the fires were discovered; 20 per cent of them were prosecuted.

In the half-year forest fire report, Wicker also released the following totals of tree seedlings that have been planted in the county during the last planting season: loblolly, 578,450; longleaf, 47,975; slash, 653,000; red cedar, 6,100; yellow poplar, 5,000; and white pine, 2,000.
