**Efforts Are Made To Take Gyps Out Of Pest Control**

A move to take "gyps" out of the pest control business has been underway for the past year by the Structural Pest Control Commission, according to Dr. Clyde F. Smith, head of the entomology department of N. C. State College.  
Smith, recently elected chairman of the commission, says that the commission has been busy setting up the framework for licensing the pest control operators in North Carolina and also in preparing rules, regulations, and minimum standards for them to follow.

Here are a few tips which will help make sure you are dealing with a reliable pest control operator:  
If possible, deal with "home-folks" whom you know. Be sure he has an established headquarters and dependable local reputation.  
Insist on knowing what he is going to do and obtain an estimate of the cost. If not satisfied, obtain estimates from other operators. There's no secret formula for controlling termites.

Ask him to show you the damage or the pest. If you are troubled with termites and the colony is active, soldier and worker termites will be present when you break into the damaged timbers. Also, if the damage is caused by termites and not decay, there will be mud in the damaged timbers where the termites have eaten wood away.

Beware if he wants to charge by the number of gallons of materials used. This does not give a true picture of the work that is needed to control the termites.

**Former Aberdeen Resident Dies Of Polio In Calif.**

Betty Worth, 23, daughter of the Rev. Charles W. Worth of Whiteville and the late Grace McAlpine Worth, died in a San Francisco hospital last Thursday afternoon.  
Miss Worth, who formerly lived in Aberdeen when her father was the Presbyterian pastor there, was stricken with bulbar polio about a month ago and was totally paralyzed. She developed pneumonia last week, and later contracted measles. Death was attributed to these complications.  
She was born in China where her parents were missionaries of the Presbyterian Church. She was a graduate of Aberdeen High School and attended Flora MacDonald College before entering nurse training in the San Francisco hospital where death occurred.
