## Homer Cummings, **Founder of Unique Golf Event**, Dies

Former U. S. Attorney General Homer Cummings, founder of a unique golf tournament held twice each year in the Sand-hills, died at his home in Washington Monday of a heart ailment. He was 86.

Mr. Cummings, who was the late President Roosevelt's first attorney general and an ardent supporter of the New Deal, was long prominent in public affairs of the nation. One of the best known lawyers in the nation when he assumed the attorney general's office in 1933, he fathered the plan to enlarge the Supreme Court when, in the early days of the New Deal, the Court continually blocked President Roosevelt's proposed legislation.
