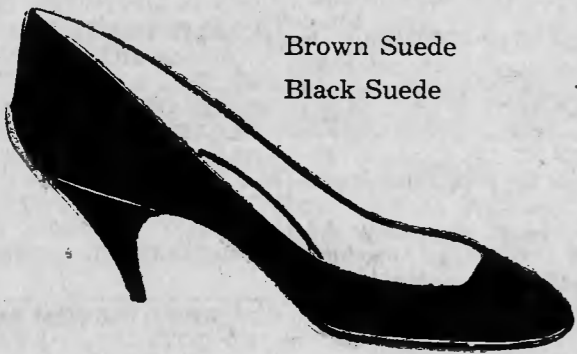

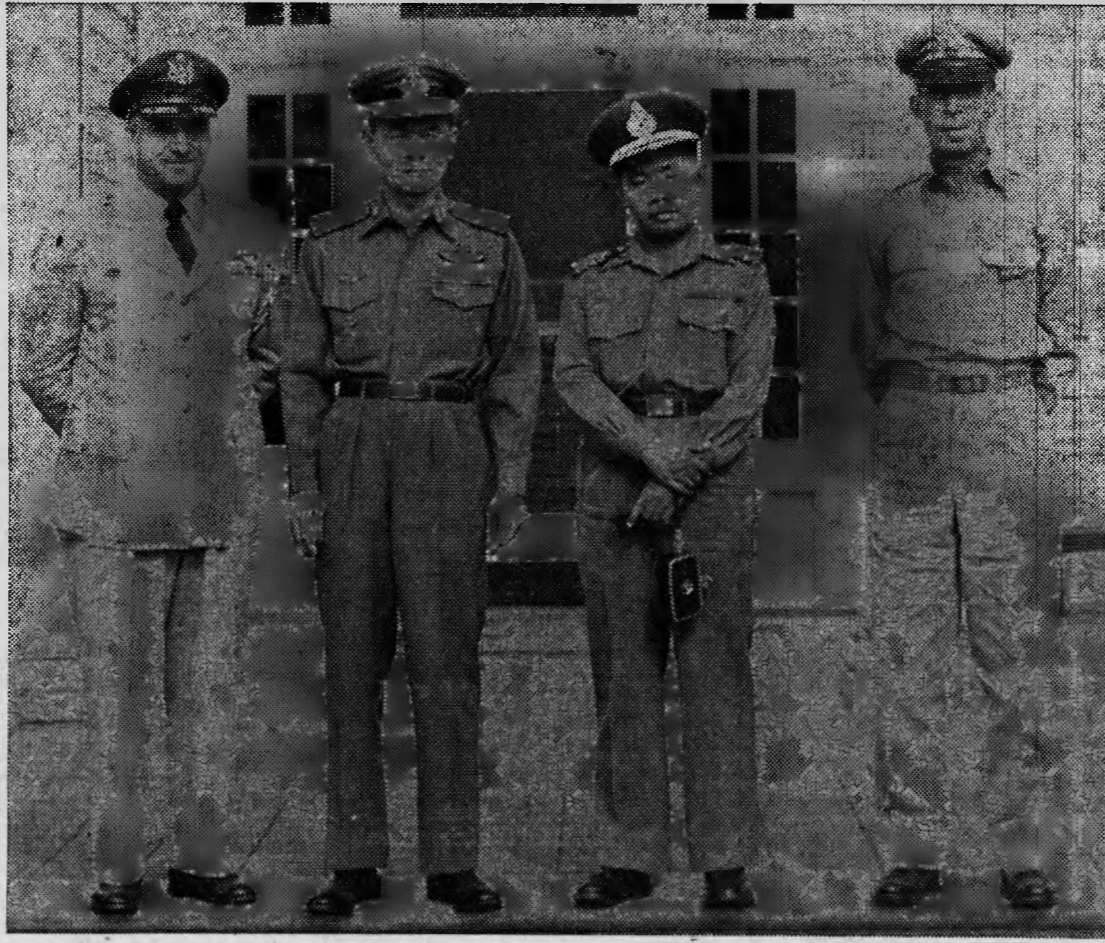

Three Officers From Thailand Are Visiting Air Force School Here

Important visitors at the USAF Air-Ground Operations School this week included Air Chief Marshal Chert Vudhakas, Deputy Commander-in-Chief, Royal Thai Air Force, accompanied by Air Vice Marshal Manob Suriya, Director of Intelligence and Liaison, RTAF, and Group Captain Sontorn Sundarakul, Tactical Air Command Maintenance Officer, RTAF.

Colonel W. P. Mullin, USAF, accompanied the party as escort officer.

Air Chief Marshal Vudhakas, a graduate of the Thailand Military Academy in 1927, is Deputy Minister of Education in Thailand.

Air Vice Marshal Suriya, who was a student at the Air-Ground Operations School here in August, 1953, attended Lafayette College and graduated from the U. S. Military Academy in 1937. Subsequently he completed flying training at Randolph and Kelly AFB in 1938, and later graduated from the U. S. Air Command and Staff School in 1952.

Group Captain Sundarakul, a graduate of the University of Washington, served in the office of Strategic Service from 1943 to 1946.

The visit to the Air-Ground Operations School is part of a 41-day stay in the United States. The Air Force is conducting the group on a tour of important U. S. Air Force bases during 15 of their 41 days in this country.
