

F. A. Langley, 75, Winter Resident At Pinehurst, Dies

Frederick A. Langley, 75, a former winter resident at The Carolina Hotel in Pinehurst, died suddenly of a heart attack October 22 at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Charles Hopegood, in Dorset, England.

Mr. Langley, who spent the seasons 1942 to 1954 at Pinehurst, was an enthusiastic bowler. Instrumental in starting the bowling greens at the Pinehurst Country Club, he worked with Richard S. Tufts on the organization of the spring tournaments.

West End Furniture Factory Worker Badly Beaten By Montgomery Co. Trio

In what was described by Sheriff C. J. McDonald as the "meanest crime ever to take place in Moore County," a 64-year old West End factory worker was badly beaten up, apparently for no reason, as he left work last Wednesday.

Hal A. McKinnon, who works in a West End furniture factory, told law officers that three people, all from Montgomery County, jumped him as he left his work and gave him a terrible beating, so severe that he had to be taken to Moore County Hospital.

The three were later identified as Otis Lemmons, 39 his wife, Pauline, 27, and Lester Parks

While they were investigating the assault they learned from the Montgomery County sheriff's office that they had investigated a wreck in which Lemmons and his wife were injured. Sheriff McDonald asked that they be held.

Parks, who was uninjured in the accident, which had happened as the three made their way back to Montgomery County after the alleged beating, was arrested several days later.

McKinnon said that the three jumped him for no apparent reason. Some talk in the area had it that the three were angry because "McKinnon had been talking about them."

Sammy Furr, who is employed along with McKinnon in the plant in West End, saw the altercation and went to McKinnon's aid, but received a beating himself.

Sheriff McDonald said that Lemmons was still in the hospital as a result of injuries received in the wreck, but would have to face trial. It is believed that he will also go before the magistrate and ask for bond.

Mrs. Lemmons and Parks have been cited to appear in Moore Recorder's Court as soon as Lemmons is able to join them.

They have been charged with assault with a deadly weapon, inflicting serious and permanent injury.
