Last Rites Conducted In Raleigh **Today For Rev. Francis Osborne**

The Rev. Francis Moore Osborne, 77, who retired in 1940 after 35 years of distinguished service in the Episcopal ministry, died Friday at Moore County Hospital after a short illness.

He served for 15 years at Charlotte, 12 years at the Theological Seminary of the University of the South at Sewanee, Tenn., then for eight years at Pittsburgh, Pa.

Funeral services were held at Christ Episcopal Church, in Raleigh, Wednesday at 3 p.m., conducted by the Right Rev. Austin Pardue, Bishop of Pittsburgh; the Rev. R. N. Rollitt, of Pittsburgh; the Rev. Martin Caldwell, of Emmanuel Episcopal Church, Southern Pines; the Rev. James Mc-Dowell Dick, of the Church of the Good Shepherd, and the Rev. Stephen Walke, rector of Christ Church.

Burial followed in Oakwood Cemetery, Raleigh.
