

IN RECORDER'S COURT

Laurinburg Man Bound To January Criminal Term On Theft Charges

Probable cause was found in Moore Recorder's Court Monday against Willie J. Brown, 32, for breaking and entering a West Southern Pines store recently and he will be tried in Superior Court in the January term.

Brown, a Laurinburg Negro, had been arrested in Wagram for breaking into Pugh's Variety Shop November 26. Southern Pines police officer Robert Yonts worked on the case and gathered evidence that pointed to Brown as the person who broke into the store and rifled the juke box and cigarette machine.

Evidence in court Monday showed that Brown has been in trouble before and has a number of brushes with the law in Laurinburg.

Other cases disposed of:

Willie Roberts alias Willie Robertson, Carthage, larceny of merchandise from Lee's Store, 18 months on roads, suspended on payment of costs and on condition he leave Moore County and not return during next five years. Defendant required to leave within 24 hours, this suspended sentence at request of defendant.

Manuel Antone, Fort Bragg, driving drunk, careless and reckless driving, accident, \$100 and costs, license revoked 12 months.

James Waylord Smith, West End, driving drunk, careless and reckless driving, improper equipment, 60 days on roads, suspended on payment of \$125 and costs, license revoked 12 months.

Henry Hoover, Cameron, carrying concealed weapon, larceny from McRae's Grocery, six months on roads. It appears to court that defendant was convicted of assault and battery July 2, 1956, and given 60 days on roads, which was suspended on payment of a fine and on good behavior conditions for 12 months and that he has violated the terms of that judgment. It is now ordered into effect to run concurrently with a term of six months here.

Leon Green, Route 2, Candor, public drunk, unlawful possession,

\$15 and costs.

Johnny W. Adams, Fort Bragg, driving without license, \$10 and costs.

Lillian Tyson, Southern Pines, driving without license (second offense), prayer for judgment continued on payment of \$25 and costs and on condition she not operate a vehicle on the public highways until she obtain proper license.

Harley Dewey Mackie, Winston Salem, driving drunk, careless and reckless driving, no valid operator's license, \$100 and costs, license revoked 12 months.

Eddie Lee Frye, Route 2, Carthage, driving drunk, careless and reckless driving, accident, property damage and leaving scene of accident, not guilty of driving drunk or hit and run. Guilty of careless and reckless driving, 60 days on roads, suspended on payment of repair bills to other car.

Laura M. Deyoe, Aberdeen, speeding \$5 and costs.

Mack Monroe and Pauline Stroman, both Southern Pines, the male defendant for violation of prohibition laws and transporting the female for aiding and abetting. As to both, three months in jail, he to serve the time working on the public roads. Both sentences suspended for two years on condition they pay a joint fine of \$50 and costs and be of good behavior next two years. The automobile to be forfeited and sold as provided by law with the funds to be turned over to the county school fund.

Everette Ray Needham, larceny, breaking and entering, fraud, continued to next Monday. Defendant also charged in other case with driving without operator's license, also continued; bond fixed at \$500.

Franklin W. Lyle, Southern Pines, trespass, temporary larceny. From the evidence before the court, the court is of the opinion that the violation is only a technical violation. Prayer for judgment continued on payment of costs and on further condition defendant purchase and give to Southern Pines school a basketball of equal value to one he took.

Mack Malone, Pinehurst, careless and reckless driving, failure to stop at stop sign, 30 days on roads, suspended on payment of \$25 and costs.

Carl Brady, Highfalls, assault with deadly weapon (chair) and threats. Nol pros.

Kenneth Arnold Sandy, Sanford, affray, creating disturbance, 60 days on roads, suspended for 12 months on payment of \$25 and costs.

W. E. Roe, Columbia, S. C., driving with improper license plates, \$25 cash bond forfeited.

Edward McMannen, Southern Pines, speeding 80 in 35 zone, three months on roads, suspended on payment of \$100 and costs. Defendant filed notice of appeal to Superior Court, bond fixed at \$350.

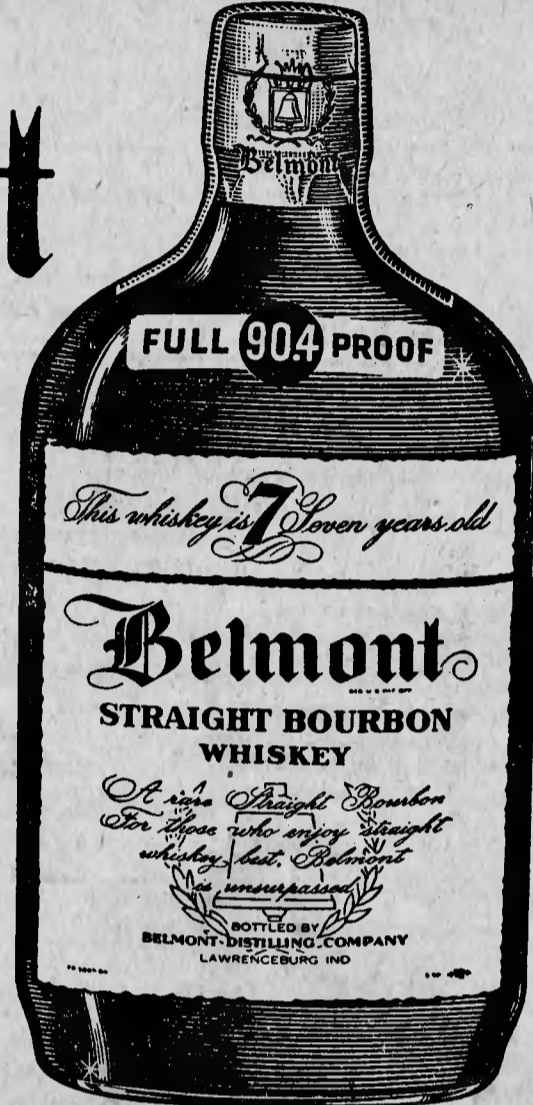

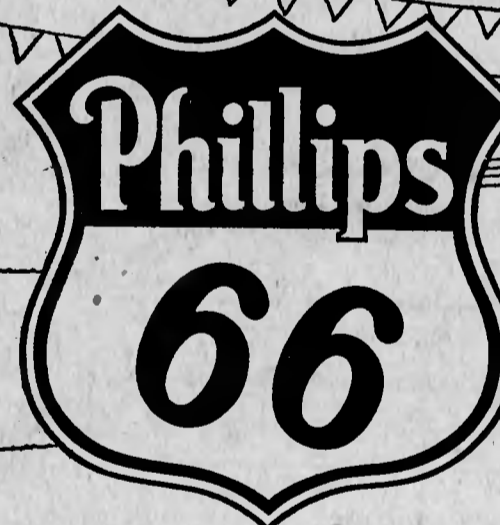
