Dawson Speaks At Kiwanis Meet On School Problems

Public schools of today are doing a better job of educating than they have ever done. The most serious problem facing public education is scarcity of teachers for the future, what with pupil enrollment in North Carolina increasing by 30,000 a year.

Dr. Amos Dawson, superintendent of schools in Southern Pines, talked on schools in general and in this community in particular before the Sandhills Kiwanis Club on Wednesday. The luncheon meeting was held in the Hollywood Hotel.

Dawson discussed what people want and expect from schools, and what industry expects. The latter, he said, emphasizes the need of a good general education, rather than one to fit graduates for a particular industry. Management tells the educators that, given a well-rounded boy or girl, they can and will train him or her for available jobs. The manufacturer does place emphasis on mathematics and science in that general education.

He reported that tests here in the elementary school had shown the pupils well ahead of the national average. Also, that the three schools in Moore county, Aberdeen, Pinehurst and Southern Pines, which supplement State funds for their support, appear to have a higher rating than the county's schools which are not The junior and senior classes locally aided.
