The memory of Dr. Thaddeus A. Cheatham, for many years minister of the Village Chapel in Pinehurst, was honored by the adop-tion of a resolution of respect by the Pinehurst Religious Association recently.
Dr. Cheatham died November 4.

Portions of the resolution read: "As a man he was a good citizen, interetsed in all good works, he contributed largely to the neareradication of tuberculosis from Moore County through his work as treasurer of the Tuberculosis contact with the afflicted.

"Hundreds of needy families have been made happy at Christmas because Dr. Cheatham collected money, bought clothing, food, toys, fruit and candies and distributed them among families whose needs he knew . . .
