 The New York Times says it is funny-touching-warm and natural comedy.

Coming Sunday through Wednesday, Dec. 30-Jan. 2, is the re-issue of the famous production, "Rebecca."
 When this Academy Award-winning screen adaptation of the famous novel by Daphne Du Maurier was first reviewed on March 23, 1940, David O. Selznick was credited with again scoring "an impressive masterpiece expertly acted and directed that should prove a natural for class houses."
 For those who have read the Daphne Du Maurier novel, the picture will completely fulfill their expectations. By others it will be welcomed as an intensely dramatic and emotionally, effective film.
 There are superb performances by Joan Fontaine, Laurence Olivier, Judith Anderson, George Sanders, Reginald Denny and Florence Bates. With the sole exception of "Gone With the Wind," Selznick has never brought a finer production to the screen, and one of its outstanding features is Alfred Hitchcock's direction, a notable job in every respect.
 This important production is now being re-released notionally with the second "premiere" (the original world debut was held March 28, 1940 at Radio City Music Hall) taking place at the Columbia Theatre, Washington. It is truly a thriller and still ranks as one of Hitchcock's best suspense masterpieces.
 As the running time is 130 minutes, there will be but two Sunday shows, at 3 p.m., and 8:15 p.m.
 Starting Thursday, Jan. 3, at 8:15 is the return to the Sandhills of "Bus Stop," starring Marilyn Monroe and Don Murray with Arthur O'Connell, Eileen Heckert and Betty Field.
