**Duke Speech Pathologist Evaluates
Problems of Local School Students**

Dr. Roderick Ormandy, speech pathologist at Duke University, screened 30 students in the Southern Pines schools Friday and singled out seven with speech difficulties to receive corrective treatment.

Dr. Ormandy, well-respected in his field, was in Southern Pines on a visit sponsored by the county chapter of the N. C. Society of Crippled Children and Adults. This was his first visit to Southern Pines, although he has visited Carthage in the past.

Taking the children, who were recommended by their teachers and parents, Dr. Ormandy evaluated the problems each had in his speech and suggested a definite plan of corrective measures. Not all treatment will be of a medical nature, he told the students; part of it will be directed at overcoming any mental blocks that might have caused defects.

Contributions made through the annual Easter Seal Sales campaign paid for the visit and will, according to Roger Gibbs, county chairman of the Seal Sales drive, pay for other visits when the need arises.

Miss Mary Logan, teacher at Southern Pines High School, arranged the visit. She is a director of the county chapter of the N. C. Society for Crippled Children and Adults.

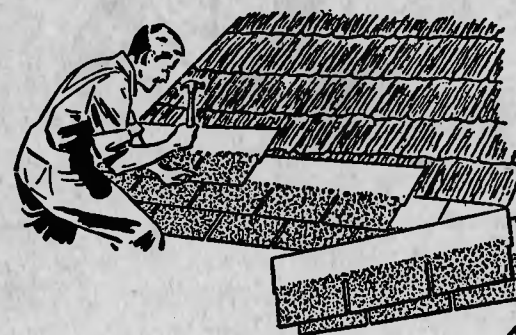
Asking the question, "Can

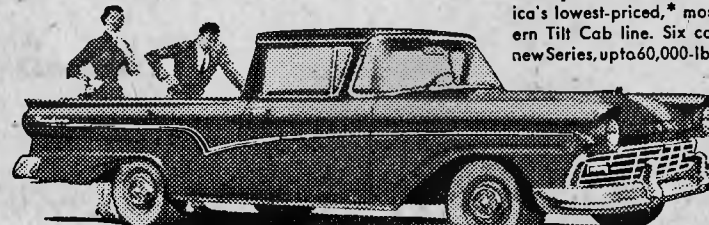

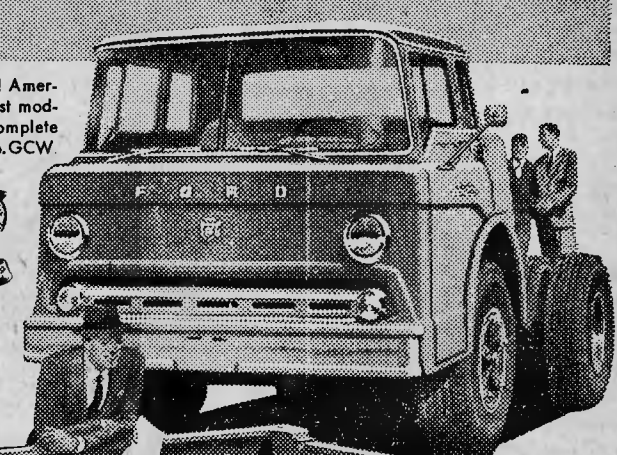
