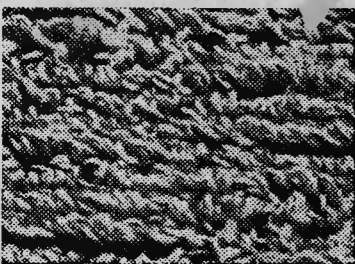


**HAVE YOU SEEN . . .**

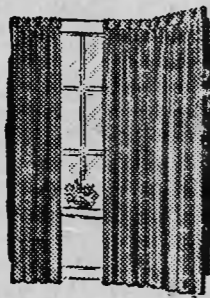

**SOUTHERN PINES**

**THEATRES CAROLINA**

Continuing at the Carolina Theatre this Thursday-Saturday, is the controversial production, "Baby Doll," which is probably the most talked about picture of the season.

Based on an original Tennessee Williams story, this is a tense drama that producer-director Elia Kazan has turned into an absorbing film by his expert handling of the players and situations involved.

"Baby Doll" is in the strictly adult classification.

Returning to the Sandhills, Sunday through Tuesday, is the screen version of the Rogers and Hammerstein stage classic "Oklahoma" which has given a rousing treatment that captures the tuneful delight of the stage original. Produced on a grand scale with color, this is a truly ambitious offering.

The cast is happily chosen, all principals giving excellent performances, with such established talent as Gordon MacRae, Gloria Grahame, Gene Nelson, Charlotte Greenwood, and Shirley Jones.

The Rodgers music and Hammerstein lyrics are presented with charm and verve by the principals, the best known of the tunes coming across in fine style and enhanced by production sequences and locales impossible for the stage to duplicate.

in the original stage play, it is a powerful emotional drama that holds auditors in a tense grip. Given an "adult" classification, the picture is superb theatre in every department.

The lusty and provocative yarn of a gay scoundrel's adventures in a western ghost town inhabited by four trigger-happy, man-hungry women. "The King and Four Queens" filmed in Cinemascope and De Luxe color opens Sunday at the Sunrise Theatre. Clark Gable is co-starred as the King of the title, and his co-

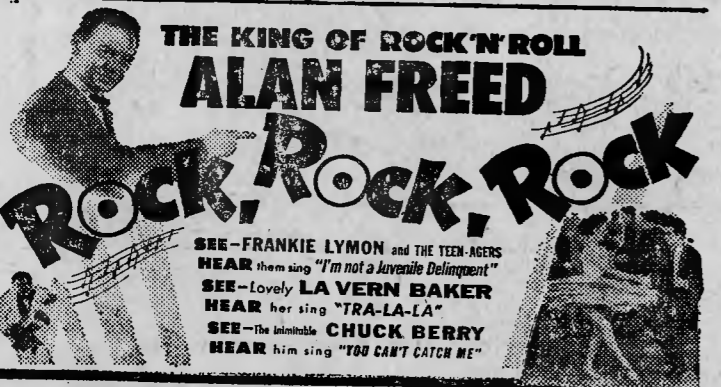

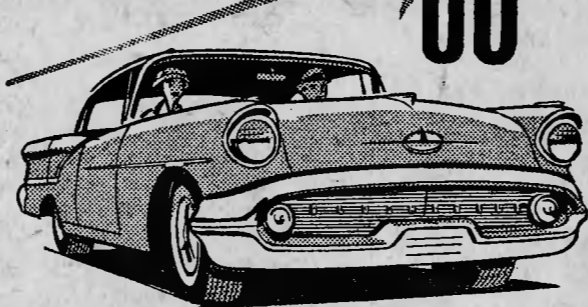

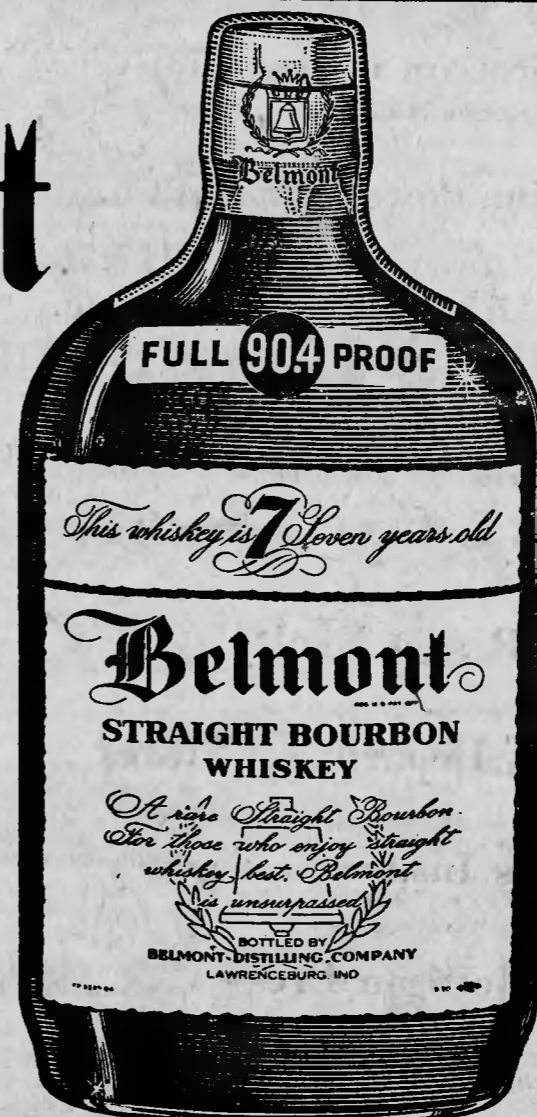
