there are small white or green worms with black heads.

If the worm is found, he said, farmers should spray their fields with heptachlor poison, at the rate of one-fourth pound per acre.

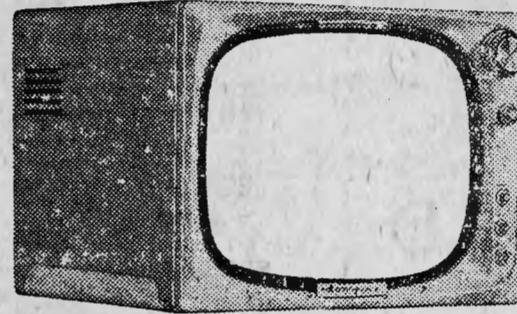

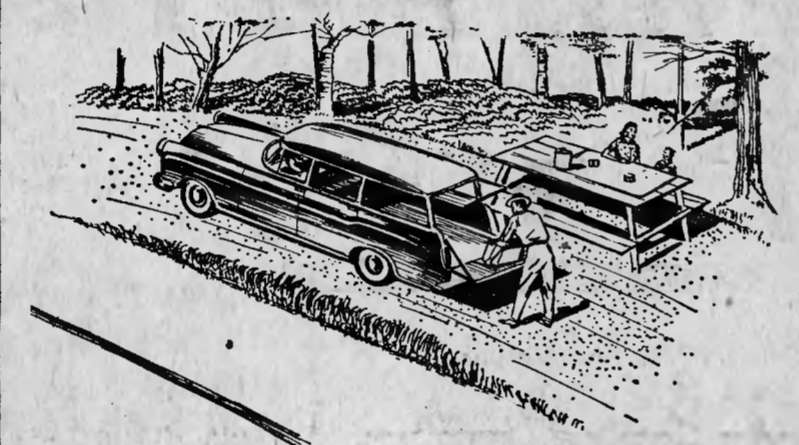

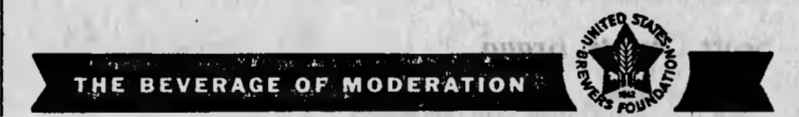
