IN RECORDER'S COURT

**Two Convicted For Fighting In
North Side Place; One Appeals**

William L. Parrish of Aberdeen, charged with creating a disturbance in a public place, and Glenn Loxie Pope of Southern Pines, charged with cursing and engaging in an affray, were found guilty in Recorder's Court Saturday and ordered to pay fines of \$25 each, plus costs, or go to the roads for 30 days. According to testimony they had been fighting in the North Side Service Station in Southern Pines. Parrish pleaded not guilty. Pope entered a guilty plea. Jim Douglas, proprietor of the service station, described the fight. Following his testimony defense counsel contended that he had merely described a "conversation" and not a fight. Recalled to the stand, Douglas said, in response to the attorney's question: "Don't you think they were only playing?", "If it was, it was mighty hard play." A four-month road sentence,

which had been suspended, from a previous judgment, was ordered into commitment for Parrish, who noted an appeal and made bond of \$350. Pope was also ordered by Judge Rowe to pay a \$15.50 repair bill to the station's jukebox. Other cases disposed of: John W. Fisher, Fayetteville, driving without license, and Alex Joseph Finowitz, Raleigh, aiding and abetting, judgment continued on payment of joint fine of

\$25 and costs.

Arnold C. Lambert, Robbins, careless and reckless driving, accident (defendant's car destroyed), judgment continued on payment of \$25 and costs.

Fletcher Smith, Eagle Springs, unlawful possession of illicit whiskey, 30 days on roads, suspended on payment of \$25 including costs.

John William Ray, Route 3, Carthage, driving without license, 30 days on roads, suspended on payment of \$5 and costs.

James Lee Gillis, Southern Pines, driving with expired license, judgment continued on payment of costs.

Wayne Robert Jessup, Route 1, Bennett, driving while drunk,

careless and reckless driving, 60 days on roads, suspended on payment of \$100 and costs, license revoked 12 months. Notice of appeal to Superior Court filed, bond fixed at \$300.

James O. Doby, Carthage, improper equipment, judgment continued on payment of \$25 including costs.
