With The Armed Forces

Airman Charles F. Baker, 22, son of Mrs. Mattie Fry Baker, 125 E. Vermont Ave., Southern Pines, is completing the first phase of his basic military training at the "Gateway to the Air Force," Lakeland Air Force Base, San Antonio, Texas.

Upon completion of this training, he will be assigned to an Air Force technical training course or an advanced basic training course leading to a specialized Air Force job.

While at Lakeland the new enlistee undergoes the transition from civilian to airman through a program which includes processing, aptitude testing, physical conditioning, survival and weapons training, and classroom studies ranging from citizenship to military customs and courtesies.

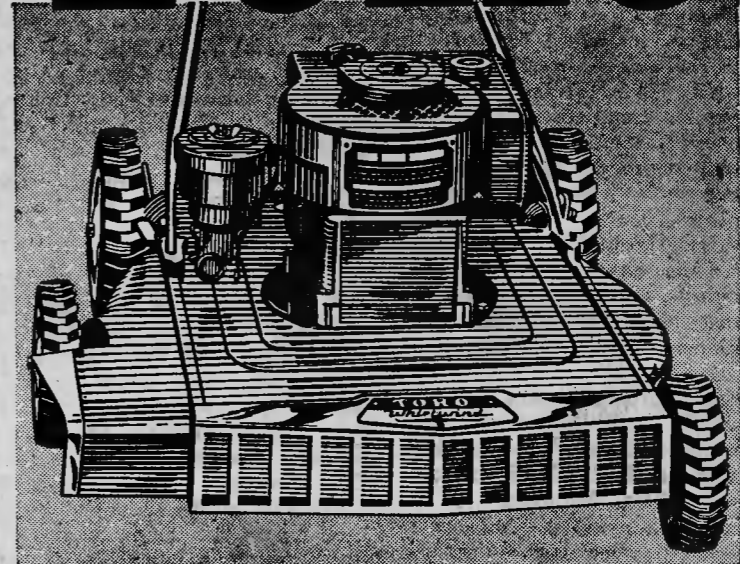
