### Employment Shows Slight Increase For 2nd Quarter

Average employment in Moore County during the second quarter of this year amounted to 4,697, according to figures just released by the North Carolina Employment Security Commission.

The figure represented a gain of 1.1 per cent, as compared with the first quarter of the year. Figures for the corresponding period last year were not available.

The commission, which keeps a constant check on the employment picture in all areas of the state through employer payments each month, said that total wages paid in the county during the second quarter reached \$3,081,136, with an average weekly wage of \$50.46.

Statewide, the average weekly wage of the insured worker group in the second quarter was \$61.87, some \$2.11 more than the second quarter of 1956.
