- BE IT ORDAINED** by the Town Council of the Town of Southern Pines at regular session assembled this 12th day of May, 1959, that an Ordinance be adopted to amend the Zoning Ordinance as follows:
- Section V, Residence II Districts A. Uses permitted (5). Land lying adjacent to business district may be used for off-street parking purposes when necessary for the business affected, after the Board of Zoning Adjustment holds public hearing this variance may be granted.
 - Section XI — BOARD OF ZONING ADJUSTMENT 6. The Board of Zoning Adjustment may permit a variance after holding a public hearing to allow land lying within a residential district and adjacent to the business district to be used for off-street parking purposes when necessary for the conduct of the business affected.
