### Contest For Carolina Artists To Be Held Again At Lancaster, S. C.

The second annual \$1,000 Army Reserve Training Center Show will be held at Lancaster, S. C., March 1. The contest was inaugurated in 1957 by the late Col. Elliott Springs as a means of encouraging artistic talent in the two Carolinas.

Prizes totaling \$1,000 are provided by The Springs Cotton Mills and include a \$500 first prize, a \$250 second prize, a \$100 third prize and 4th, 5th and 6th prizes of \$50 each.

The first contest showing was held in January, 1958, in the Lancaster National Guard Armory, with 147 works of art on exhibit. Winner of this first contest was Phillip Moose of Charlotte.

More than 40 entries have already been received in the second contest, which is open to all residents of North and South Carolina. Entry notices will be received up to February 1, 1960. All art works entered in the contest must be delivered in Lancaster not later than February 18. The public exhibition will be open March 1 and will be held in the Army Reserve Training Center instead of the Lancaster Armory.

Rules for the 1960 contest are unchanged from last year except that each contestant may enter two works instead of one. Works of art entered in the contest may be in any medium without restriction as to materials, technique or subject matter, but they must be originals, not more than two years old, which have not been previously entered in a contest.

Entries winning cash prizes become the property of The Springs Cotton Mills. The Springs organization also reserves the right to make selections from the entire list of entries for exhibition in art galleries, schools and other worthy organizations for a reasonable length of time after the contest showing.
