Wet Earth Makes Trenching Danger

State Labor Commissioner Frank Crane has cautioned contractors and other persons working on trenching operations of unusually dangerous ground conditions created by recent snows and rains, increasing the probability of cave-ins and landslides. Crane said the Labor Department has issued a special Safety Bulletin on trenching and excavations. The bulletin contains exact information, with explanatory diagrams, on proper and adequate shoring to protect workers from cave-in hazards. Copies will be sent free to all who request them, he said, from the N. C. Department of Labor at Raleigh.
