sociate organist, playing for the evening preaching services and working with the music director and the pastor in planning special music features for these services. Miss Fields is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Gene Fields of Southern Pines. She has been studying under Mrs. C. R. Mills for some time and has been playing the organ for the church from time to time.

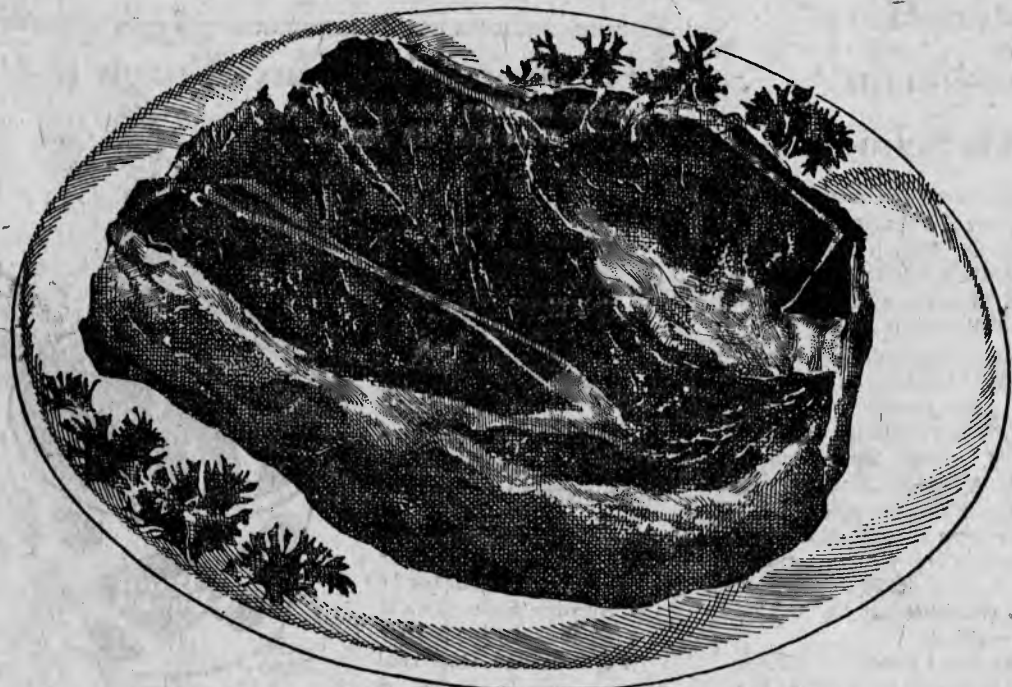
Both Miss King and Mrs. Howerton have accepted and are at

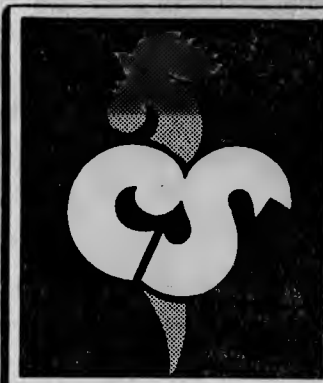
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
