The address is that of the old Patch's Department Store building, which was recently purchased by Mahoney at public auction. The new corporation is chartered "to buy and sell real estate, build and mortgage buildings, manufacture and deal in goods and wares, real and personal, buy, sell and trade and conduct a general merchandising business."
