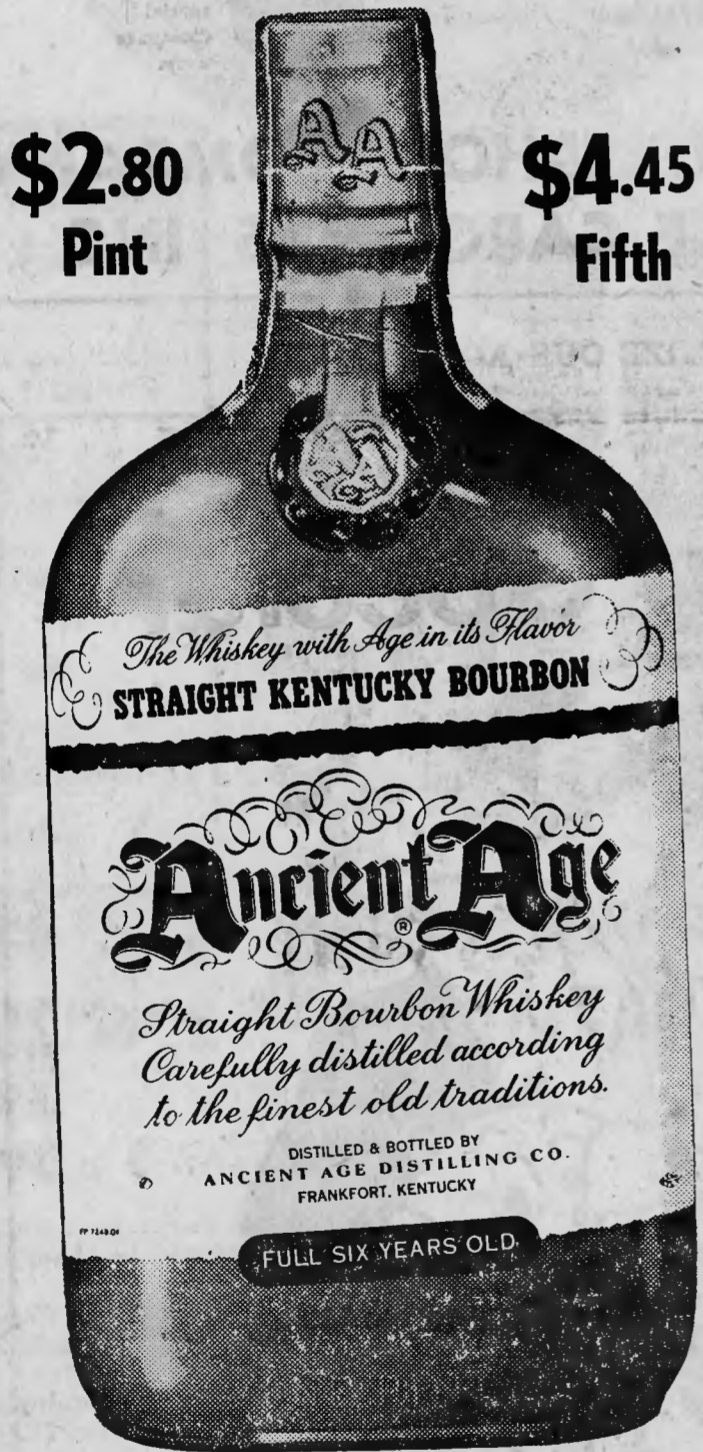

MOORE COUNTY RECORDER'S COURT

Prisoners Who Escaped Get 4 Months To Begin at End of Present Terms

Escaping from the Carthage prison camp cost two prisoners sentences of four additional months, each, in Moore County Recorder's Court at Carthage Monday. Judge J. Vance Rowe sentenced each of the men, the sentences to begin at expiration of the terms they are serving. The prisoners were Charles E. Morgan of Asheboro and James C. Huggins of Rockingham, RFD.

In contrast to the past two weeks, the court heard a short docket of cases Monday, completing its work about noon. Other cases were:

Henry Mitchell, Route 2, Carthage, driving without operator's license, \$15 and costs; Adam Julian Wyatt, Robbins, no chauffeur's license, improper brakes, no operator's license, 30 days on the roads, suspended on payment of \$25 fine and costs; Floyd Glover Patterson, Vass, drunken driving, 60 days on the roads, suspended on payment of \$100 fine and costs, driver's license to be revoked for 12 months; Ernest B. Phillips Route 5, Sanford, careless and reckless driving, 30 days on the roads, suspended on payment of \$35 fine and costs; David McLeod, Carthage, drunken driving, driving without operator's license, failure to stop for officer, three months on the roads, suspended on payment of \$25 fine and costs and on condition that he not operate a motor vehicle on the public roads until he obtains a license.

James Belk, Route 3, Carthage, assaulting wife, non-support of five minor children, found guilty of assault, 30 days on roads, suspended on payment of costs, not guilty of non support; Winford Walker, Route 3, Carthage, driving without operator's license, \$10

and costs; Victor McLeod, Vass, unlawful possession of illicit whiskey for sale, three months on the roads, suspended for two years on payment of \$100 fine and costs and on condition he does not violate the prohibition laws during that time, the sheriff ordered to destroy the whiskey (six jars). Lane Duncan, Route 2, Loris, S. C., non-support of wife and child, three months on the roads, suspended on payment of the costs and payment of \$10 on day of court and \$10 per week thereafter for use and benefit of his wife and child, until further orders of the court; Lawrence Lyerly, Pinehurst, motion by wife to increase support payments be granted, weekly payments to be increased from \$30 to \$37.50, plus payments for support of child one-half of commissions or other earnings, as before; Rankin Strider, Carthage, motion to increase support payments to be granted, beginning last week.

I. J. Short, 42, Rt. 3, Carthage, Dies Suddenly

Irvin Jasper Short, 42, of Carthage, Route 3, died suddenly Thursday night of last week. He was a World War II veteran and operated a store and gas station on Carthage Route 3.

Mr. Short is survived by his wife, the former Annie Love of Carthage; two daughters, Betty Ann Love and Mrs. Floyd Sheffield, both of the home; five sons, Irvin Wayne of Delaney, Fla. and Marvin Douglas, Gary Lee, Edward Earl and Samuel Ernest Short, all of the home; two sisters, Mrs. Henry Freeman and Mrs. William Barber, both of Route 3, Carthage; one brother, Lewis Short of Carthage, Route 3, and three grandchildren. Funeral services were held Saturday at the Doubts Chapel Methodist Church, conducted by the Rev. Melvin Williamson. Burial followed in the church cemetery.

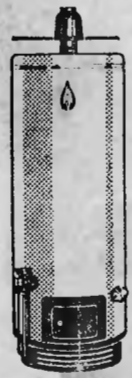

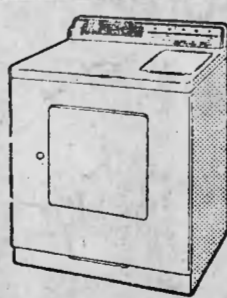

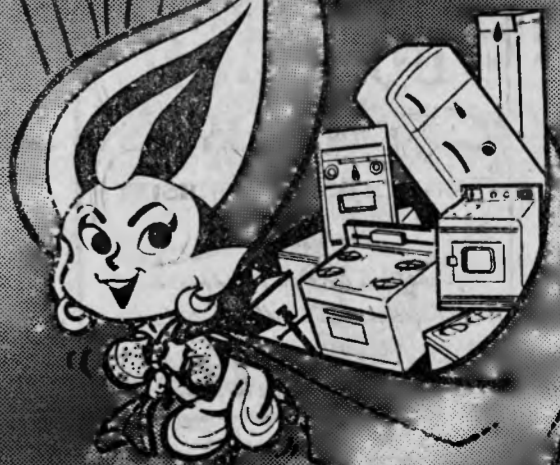
