mas miracle. Later, as he tried to put down on paper his feeling and experience, the words kept turning into verse. When dawn came he found he had written a poem -a beautiful and moving poem. On Christmas Day his friend, Franz Xaver Gruber, music teacher in the village school composed music to fit the verse.
