AN ORDINANCE FOR THE LICENSING AND REGULATION OF DOGS

BE IT ORDAINED AND ESTABLISHED by the Town Council of the Town of Southern Pines in regular session assembled on the 14th day of November, 1961, as follows:

Section I. DEFINITION OF TERMS. As used in this Ordinance unless the context otherwise indicates.

(a) "Dog" shall be intended to mean both male and female.
(b) "Owner" shall be intended to mean any person or persons, firm, association or corporation owning, keeping, or harboring a dog.

(c) "At Large" shall be intended to mean off the premises of the owner, and not under the control of the owner or a member of his immediate family or some responsible person either by leash, cord, chain or otherwise.
Section II. LICENSE AND REGISTRATION REQUIRED. All dogs kept, harbored or maintained by their owners in the Town of Southern Pines shall be registered if over six (6) months of age. Dog licenses shall be issued by the Town Clerk upon payment of a license of \$1.00 for each male or spayed female, and \$2.00 for each unspayed female. The owner shall state at the time application is made for such license and upon printed forms provided for such purpose his name and address, and the name, breed, color and sex of each dog owned or kept by him. The provisions of this section shall not be intended to apply to dogs whose owners are non residents temporarily within the Town, nor to dogs brought into the Town for the purpose of participating in any Dog Show, nor to "Seeing-Eye" Dogs properly trained to assist blind persons when such dogs are actually being used by blind persons for the purpose of aiding them in going from place to place.

Section III. TAG AND COLLAR. Upon payment of the license fee, the Clerk shall issue to the owner a license certificate and a metallic tag for each dog so licensed. The shape of the tags shall be changed every year and shall have stamped thereon the year for which it was issued and the number corresponding with the number on the certificate. Every owner shall be required to provide each dog with a collar to which the license tag must be affixed, and shall see that the collar and tag are constantly worn. In case a dog tag is lost or destroyed, a duplicate will be issued by the Clerk upon presentation of a receipt showing the payment of the license fee for the current year, and the payment of the 50c fee for such duplicate. Dog tags shall not be transferable from one dog to another and no refund shall be made on any dog license fee because of death of the dog or the owners leaving the town before expiration of the license.

Section IV. RUNNING AT LARGE PROHIBITED. No owner or keeper of any dog shall permit such dog to run at large at any time; provided, however, that said dog may be allowed to run at large if such dog shall have a muzzle properly attached of sufficient strength to prevent its biting any person.

Section V. IMPOUNDING. It shall be the duty of every police officer, the County Dog Warden, any member of the sheriff's department or any other duly constituted officer with arresting powers to apprehend any dog found running at large contrary to the provisions of SECTION IV above and to impound such dog in the city pound, the county pound or other suitable place. The Pound Master or Dog Warden (or some other designated official) upon receiving any dogs shall make a complete registry, entering breed, color, and sex of such dog and whether licensed. If licensed he shall enter the name and address of the owner and the number of the license tag. Licensed dog shall be separated from unlicensed dogs.

Section VI. NOTICE TO OWNER AND REDEMPTION. Not later than two days after the impounding of any dog, the owner shall be notified, or if the owner is unknown written notice shall be posted for ten days at three or more conspicuous places in the Town of Southern Pines describing the dog and the place and time of taking. The owner of any dog so impounded may claim such dog upon payment of the license fee, if unpaid, and all costs and charges incurred by the Town of Southern Pines for impounding and maintenance of said dog. The following charges shall be paid to the Town of Southern Pines: For impounding any dog, \$5.00; for keeping any dog, \$1.50 per day; and for giving notice of the impounding, \$5.00.

Section VII. DISPOSITION OF UNCLAIMED OR INFECTED

DOGS. It shall be the duty of the Pound Master to keep all dogs so impounded for a period of ten (10) days. If at the expiration of ten (10) days from the date of notice to the owner or the posting of notice such dog shall not have been redeemed, it may be destroyed. Any unlicensed dog required by law to be licensed, or any dog which appears to be suffering from rabies or affected with hydrophobia, mange or other infectious or dangerous disease shall not be released but may be forthwith destroyed.

Section VIII. UNCLAIMED DOGS FOR SCIENTIFIC PURPOSES. Whenever any hospital or reputable institution of learning shall apply to the Town of Southern Pines for permission to use for research purposes in the study of prevention of disease or the betterment of mankind, any impounded dog or dogs remaining unclaimed, the Town of Southern Pines or such properly designated official thereof shall request the Pound Master to surrender to the institution or hospital such unclaimed dogs as it has requested, and they shall be so surrendered.

Section IX. CONFINEMENT OF CERTAIN DOGS. No dog of fierce, dangerous or vicious propensities and no female dog in heat, whether licensed or not, shall be allowed to run at large or upon the premises of one other than the owner. If any such dog is found running at large in violation of this provision it shall be taken up and impounded and shall not be released except upon approval of the Chief of Police or other designated authority after payment of the fees provided in SECTION VI hereof; provided, however, if any dangerous, fierce or vicious dogs so found at large cannot be safely taken up and impounded, such dog may be slain by any policeman, the county Dog Warden, any member of the sheriff's department or any other officer with arresting powers.

Section X. RABIES-NOTICE. If a dog is believed to have rabies or has been bitten by a dog suspected of having rabies, such dog shall be confined by a leash or chain on the owners premises and shall be placed under the observation of a veterinarian at the expense of the owner for a period of two (2) weeks. The owner shall notify the Chief of Police of the Town of Southern Pines of the fact that his dog has been exposed to rabies and at his discretion the Chief of Police is empowered to have such dog removed from the owners premises to a Veterinary Hospital and there placed under the observation of a doctor and other authorities of said hospital for a period of two (2) weeks at the expense of the owner. It shall be unlawful for any person knowing or suspecting a dog has rabies to allow such dog to be taken off his premises or beyond the limits of the Town without the written permission of the Chief of Police. Every owner, or other person, upon ascertaining a dog is rabid shall immediately notify the Chief of Police or some constituted authority in the Police Department who shall either remove the dog to the pound or summarily destroy it.

Section XI. VACCINATION. It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog to keep, maintain, or allow such dog to run at large whether muzzled or not unless it shall have been vaccinated by a licensed veterinary surgeon with anti-rabies vaccine, as required by the General Statutes of North Carolina.

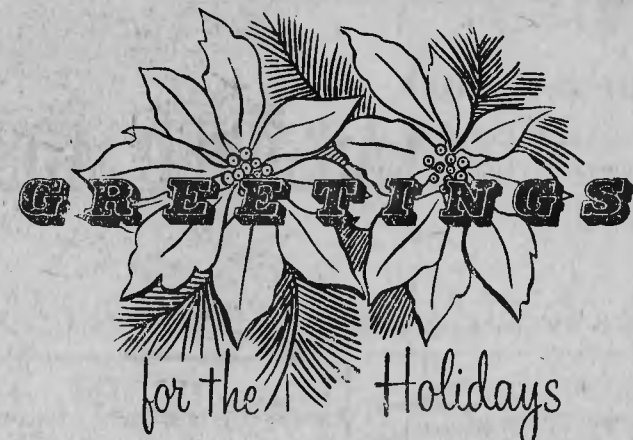
Section XII. PENALTIES. Any owner found violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$50.00 or imprisoned for a period of not more than thirty (30) days for such offense.

Section XIII. REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES. All existing Ordinances of the Town of Southern Pines are hereby repealed insofar as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section XIV. SEPARABILITY OF PROVISIONS. It is the intention of the Town Council that each separate provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed independent of all other provisions herein, and it is further the intention of the Town Council that if any provision of this Ordinance be declared invalid, all other provisions thereof shall remain valid and enforceable.

Section XV. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect January 1, 1962. Adopted this 14th day of November, 1961.

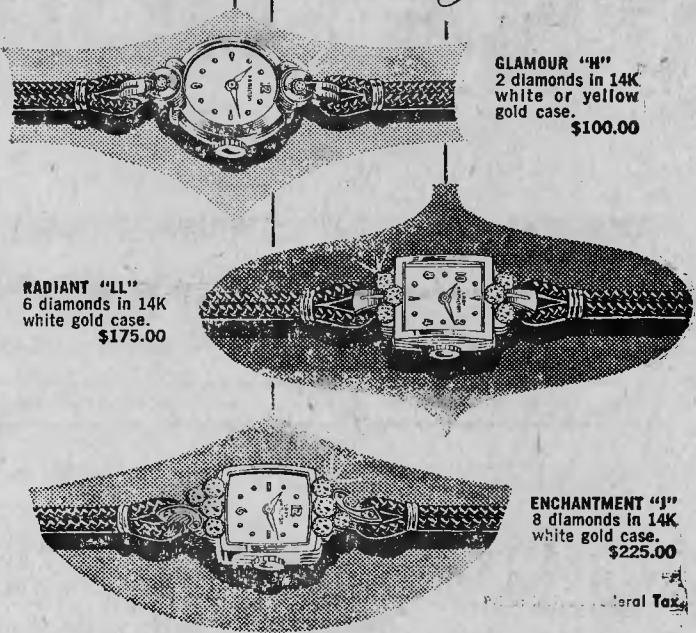
