

Norwegian Arts To Be Exhibited At St. Andrews

An exhibition of modern Norwegian arts and crafts at St. Andrews Presbyterian College, Laurinburg, will open Saturday, January 6, and continue through

Thursday, January 25. Included in the display in the north end of the Liberal Arts Building at St. Andrews are items by designers Liv Hassel, Arne Tjomsland, Rachel Weyerang and Dagny and Finn Hald.

The exhibition of dolls, seals, vases, candlesticks and other items includes arts and crafts made from textiles, whale tooth, teak wood, stainless steel and

several other media. The Information Service of the Norwegian Embassy is lending the exhibit to the college for the display.

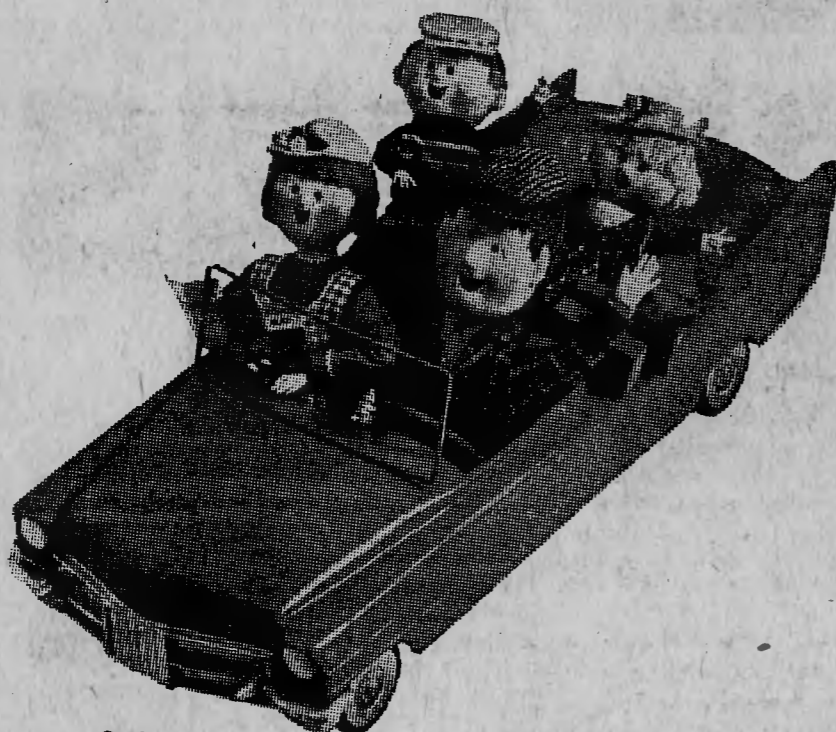
