Notice of Precincts Established Or Altered In Moore County And New Registration Of Voters

Pursuant to a resolution adopted by the County Board of Elections on the 15th day of March, 1962, and as by law provided, notice is hereby given that Spies Precinct has been eliminated and that a new precinct designated as Pinebluff has been created to take care of and accommodate some of the voters heretofore registered and voting in the Aberdeen Precinct and the Southern Pines Precinct and has been divided into two (2) precincts hereafter to be known and designated as North and South Southern Pines Precincts.

That boundaries of all the precincts of Moore County in conflict with and which fail to coincide with the boundaries hereinabove given of the several precincts have been rescinded and the boundaries and location of the several voting precincts in Moore County shall be named, designated, bounded and described as follows:

WESTMOORE PRECINCT:

BEGINNING at a point where County Road No. 1456 intersects the Randolph County line and running thence with the said County Road to a point where it intersects another County Road No. 1003 and runs thence with said Road No. 1003 to a point where Road No. 1003 intersects State Highway No. 705; running thence northerly with State Highway 705 to a point where the County Highway 1425 intersects Highway No. 705; and running thence with County Road No. 1425 to a point where County Roads 1425 and 1432 intersect; and running thence from the point of said intersection southerly with County Road 1432 to the dead end of said road; thence southeasterly to the dividing line of Sheffield and Bensalem Townships; thence with that line to the Montgomery County line; thence with the Montgomery County line northerly to the Randolph County line; thence with the Randolph County line easterly to the beginning.

ROBBINS PRECINCT:

BEGINNING at a point where County Road No. 1456 intersects Randolph County line, also the beginning corner of the Westmoore Precinct, running thence with County Road No. 1456, also the Westmoore Precinct boundary, to a point where said County Road 1456 intersects with County Road No. 1003; running thence with the Westmoore boundary to State Highway No. 705; running thence northerly along said State Highway No. 705 with the Westmoore Precinct boundary to a County Road No. 1425 and continuing with the said County Road, also the Westmoore Precinct boundary to the intersection of County Roads Nos. 1425 and 1432; running thence with the Westmoore Precinct boundary and County Road No. 1432 to the dead end of said road; thence continuing southerly to a corner of the Westmoore Precinct in the boundary of Bensalem and Sheffield Townships; running thence with the said Bensalem-Sheffield Townships line to a point, the intersection of Bensalem-Sheffield Townships line with Ritters and Sheffield Townships line near Garner's Store; thence running northerly with the said Ritters-Sheffield Townships line to the Randolph County line, thence westward to the beginning.

HIGHFALLS PRECINCT:

BEGINNING at a point where the Ritters-Sheffield Townships line intersects the Randolph County line being a corner of the boundary of Robbins Precinct, running thence easterly with the Randolph County line and the Chatham County line to a point where Deep River Township and Ritters Township boundary intersects Chatham County line; running thence with Deep River and Ritters Townships line to Deep

River; thence with the northern boundary of Deep River to a point, the Ritters-Sheffield Townships line; thence northerly with said Townships line to the beginning.

RITTERS PRECINCT:

BEGINNING at a point in the Ritters-Sheffield Township line on the northern bank of Deep River; running thence easterly with the bank of Deep River to the southern corner of Highfalls Precinct; thence with th Deep River-Ritters Townships line southerly to a point where County Roads No. 1629 and No. 1628 intersect; running thence southerly with Road No. 1628 to a point where it intersects County Road No. 1006; thence southerly with County Road No. 1006 to a point where it intersects Road No. 1644; thence southerly with County Road No. 1644 to the Township line of Carthage and Ritters Townships; running thence with the said Township line westerly to a point where Ritters-Sheffield and Bensalem Township intersects; thence with the Ritters-Sheffield Townships line northerly to and crossing Deep River to the point of beginning.

DEEP RIVER PRECINCT:

BEGINNING at a point where Deep River and Ritters Townships line intersection, the Chatham County line, the northern corner of the Highfalls Precinct; running thence easterly with the Chatham County line to Lee County; thence with the Lee County line southerly to a point where the line of Deep River Township intersects the Lee County line; running thence in a southerly direction with the Deep River-Greenwood Townships line to a point where the said line intersects the Carthage-Deep River Townships line; running thence with the Carthage-Deep River Townships line westerly to a point where Deep River and Ritters Townships line intersects Carthage Township line, also a corner of Ritters Precinct; running thence with the Township line between Ritters and Deep River Township, also a boundary of Ritters Precinct, to the beginning.

BENSALEM PRECINCT:

BEGINNING at a point where Bensalem and Sheffield Townships line intersection Montgomery County Highway No. 1002; running thence easterly with the Sheffield-Bensalem Township line to a point where it intersects Carthage Townships line; running thence with the Carthage Townships line southerly to a point where the intersection of Bensalem Township line with Ritters Township line; running thence with the Dixie Pipe Line Company gas line, crossing County Road 1803, to the beginning.

EUREKA PRECINCT:

BEGINNING at the northeast corner of Vass Precinct, running thence southerly with the Dixie Pipe Line Company gas line, crossing County Road No. 1803, to another corner of Vass Precinct; thence with County Road No. 1843 westerly to a point where said County Road intersects and crosses North Carolina Highway No. 22; thence due West to a point in the McNeill-Mineral Springs Township line; thence with the township line of McNeill Township and Mineral Springs Township line; thence East with the Carthage Township line, crossing County Road No. 1803 and County Road No. 1802, to the beginning.

NORTH SOUTHERN PINES PRECINCT:

BEGINNING at a point near the home of Mallie Kelly where the Dixie Pipe Line Company gas line is crossed by County Road No. 1843; running thence westerly with County Road No. 1843 to a point where it intersects North Carolina Highway No. 22; thence with the boundary of Eureka Precinct to Mineral Springs Township line, a corner of Eureka Precinct; thence South with Mineral Springs-McNeill Townships line, crossing County Road No. 1843 to the center of North Carolina Highway No. 2; thence easterly with North Carolina No. 2 to where it intersects County Road No. 1848; thence South with County Road No. 1848 to the town limits of Southern Pines on Pennsylvania Avenue; thence along Pennsylvania Avenue to May Street; thence North along May Street to Connecticut Avenue, County Road No. 2033; thence easterly along said County Road No. 2033 to the Hoke County line; thence with the Hoke - Moore Counties line to the boundary of Little River Township; thence with the Little River - McNeill Townships boundary northeast to where it intersects County Road No. 2026; thence northeast with County Road No. 2026, crossing U. S. Highway No. 1; thence northwesterly, crossing Seaboard Air Line Railroad and County Road No. 1861 directly to a boundary of Eureka Precinct near Mallie Kelly's residence.

SOUTH SOUTHERN PINES PRECINCT:

BEGINNING at a point where North Carolina Highway No. 2 intersects Mineral Springs-McNeill Townships line, a corner of North Southern Pines Precinct; running thence with State Highway No. 2, also a line of the boundary of North Southern

Pines Precinct, to where it intersects County Road No. 1848; thence with County Road No. 1848 southeasterly to the town limits of Southern Pines on Pennsylvania Avenue; thence southeast along Pennsylvania Avenue to May Street, a boundary of North Southern Pines Precinct; thence northerly on May Street to Connecticut Avenue; thence with Connecticut Avenue and County Road No. 2033 to the McNeill-Sandhill Townships line; thence westerly along the McNeill-Sandhill Townships line, crossing U. S. Highway No. 1 and U. S. Highway No. 15-501, thence along County Road No. 1205, crossing U. S. Highway No. 15-501, to the intersection of McNeill-Mineral Springs Townships line; thence northerly with that line to the beginning.

PINEHURST PRECINCT:

BEGINNING at the southeast corner of Mineral Springs Township near Watson's Lake, running thence westerly with Mineral Springs-Sandhill Townships line to a point where Deep Creek crosses Mineral Springs Township line; thence northerly along Deep Creek to the head of Deep Creek, the dead end of County Road No. 1121; thence proceeding northwesterly, crossing the Norfolk and Southern Railroad; thence proceeding in the same direction, crossing North Carolina Highway No. 211; thence northeasterly along County Road No. 1216 to County Road No. 1210, crossing North Carolina Highway No. 73; thence northerly with County Road No. 1210 to a point where it intersects County Road No. 1229; thence northeasterly along County Road No. 1229 to the Sandhill and Carthage Townships line; thence easterly along this township line to a point where McNeill and Mineral Springs Townships corner, a corner of Eureka Precinct; thence southerly along the Mineral Springs-McNeill Townships line to the beginning.

WEST END PRECINCT:

BEGINNING at a point in the Montgomery County line, also a corner of Bensalem Township; running thence along County Road No. 1126 to another corner of Bensalem Township line and Bensalem Precinct line; running thence northeasterly to County Road No. 1137; thence northerly along County Road No. 1137 to North Carolina Highway 211; thence with North Carolina Highway No. 211 southeasterly to the intersection of County Road No. 1137 with North Carolina Highway 211; thence with County Road No. 1241 intersects County Road No. 1240; thence crossing County Road No. 1240 and proceeding easterly to a corner of Bensalem and Carthage Townships; thence proceeding easterly, crossing County Road No. 1210, along the township line of Carthage-Mineral Springs Townships to County Road No. 1229; thence southerly along County Road No. 1229 to a point where it intersects County Road No. 1210; thence southerly along County Road No. 1210 to a point where County Road No. 1210 intersects County Road No. 1216 near Beulah Hill Church; thence southerly along County Road 1216 to and crossing North Carolina Highway No. 211 directly to the dead end of County Road No. 1121 near the head of Deep Creek southerly to the Sandhill-Mineral Springs Townships line; thence with that line westerly to a point where County Road No. 1004 and 1123 intersect; thence West along County Road No. 1123 to Drowning Creek-Richmond County line; thence northerly along Drowning Creek and the Montgomery-Richmond County line; thence with the Montgomery County line to the beginning.

PINEBLUFF PRECINCT:

BEGINNING at a point in the Richmond County line where County Road No. 1113 crosses Drowning Creek and the Richmond County line; thence easterly along County Road No. 1113, crossing County Road No. 1004 to a point where County Road No. 1113 intersects County Road No. 1112 in Roseland, and continuing thence along County Road 1112 easterly to a point where County Roads No. 1112 and 1106 intersect; thence southerly along County Road No. 1106, crossing U. S. Highway No. 1 and proceeding southerly to a point where Seaboard Air Line Railroad crosses County Road No. 1105; thence continuing easterly along County Road 1105 to a point where it intersects U. S. Highway 15-501; thence along this highway to the Hoke County line; thence with the Hoke County line to Drowning Creek; thence with Drowning Creek and the Richmond County line to the beginning.

PINEDENE PRECINCT:

BEGINNING at the intersection of the Dixie Pipe Line Company Gas Line and the Sandhill-Mineral Springs Townships line and running thence South one (1) mile to a point near Watson's Lake; thence running East to County

Road No. 1204; thence along County Road No. 1204 to U. S. Highway 15-501; thence with Highway 15-501 southerly to a point where it is intersected by County Road No. 1852; thence easterly along County Road No. 1852 to where it intersects U. S. Highway No. 1; thence easterly, crossing County Road No. 2074, also crossing County Road No. 2075, a line perpendicular to the Moore-Hoke Counties line; thence northeasterly along the Hoke-Moore Counties line to where County Road No. 2074 intersects County Road No. 2033; thence westerly along County Road No. 2033 following the McNeill-Sandhill Townships line, crossing U. S. Highway No. 1 and the Seaboard Air Line Railroad, to the corner of Mineral Springs, Sandhill and McNeill Townships line; thence with the Mineral Springs-Sandhill Townships line to the beginning.

ABERDEEN PRECINCT:

BEGINNING at the beginning point of Pinebluff Precinct near Watson's Lake on the Mineral Springs-Sandhill Townships line; running thence with this line westerly crossing North Carolina Highway 211 and crossing County Road No. 1115 and crossing County Road No. 1004 and continuing along County Road No. 1123 to the Richmond County line and Drowning Creek; thence along the Richmond County line and Drowning Creek to a point where County Road No. 1113 crosses Drowning Creek; thence with the line of Pinebluff Precinct and County Road No. 1113 to another corner of Pinebluff Precinct in Roseland and County Road No. 1112; thence along County Road No. 1112 and the line of the Pinebluff Precinct to a point where County Road No. 1112 is intersected by County Road No. 1106 to and crossing U. S. Highway No. 1 and continuing with the Pinebluff Precinct line to a point where the Seaboard Air Line Railroad crosses County Road No. 1105; thence along County Road No. 1105 easterly to where it intersects U. S. Highway No. 15-501; thence South along U. S. Highway 15-501 to the Hoke County line; thence with the Hoke County line northeasterly to a corner of Pinebluff Precinct in the Hoke County line; thence northwesterly along the Pinebluff Precinct boundary, crossing U. S. Highway No. 1 and continuing with the boundary of Pinebluff Precinct to the beginning.

Notice is hereby given that a new registration of all the voters in Moore County has been ordered and all persons who expect to vote in the primary in May, 1962, and the primaries and elections thereafter are required to register at the proper polling place.

The books will be open for this new registration of voters on Saturday, April 21, 1962, at all the polling places in Moore County and will close on Saturday, May 12, 1962, at sundown, and the registrars will be at each of the polling places on the following Saturdays: April 21, 1962, April 28, 1962, May 5, 1962 and May 12, 1962, to re-register all of the voters on the books as well as

persons not registered. Anyone who fails to re-register as above provided will not be able to vote in the primary on May 29, 1962.
