THEATRE SUNRISE

Otto Preminger's production of "Exodus," film version of the international best-seller, will start its local engagement Sunday at the Sunrise Theatre, through United Artists release.

"Exodus" stars Paul Newman, Eva Marie Saint, Ralph Richardson, Peter Lawford, Lee J. Cobb, Sal Mineo, John Derek, Hugh Griffith, Gregory Ratoff, Felix Aylmer, David Opatoshu and Jill Haworth. It was filmed on location in Israel and Cyprus in Technicolor and Super-Panavision. Otto Preminger produced and directed the film from a screenplay by Dalton Trumbo, based on the Leon Uris novel.

The novel, "Exodus," which was a hard-cover best-seller for more than a year and half, also has sold more than 6,000,000 copies in paperback. The motion picture is set in the turbulent times when the Israeli underground was battling the British and the Arabs in the struggle for independence.

Paul Newman plays Ari Ben Canaan, the heroic leader of the underground movement who spirits a group of Jews out of the British internment camps on Cyprus to Israel aboard a rusty tramp steamer, which was renamed the Exodus. Miss Saint portrays Kitty Fremont, the American nurse, who becomes involved with the movement and falls in love with Ari. Ralph Richardson is the British General, sympathetic to the cause of the Jews. Peter Lawford is the unsympathetic British army officer. Sal Mineo plays Dov, the young terrorist. Jill Haworth, the pretty 14½-year-old girl whom Preminger discovered in a London drama school, portrays Karen.

SCHEDULE OF DOG VACCINATION CLINICS

For Moore County for 1962

The North Carolina law requires that every dog four months old, or older, **MUST** be vaccinated. This vaccine is effective for three years, except that dogs being vaccinated under six months of age must be given a booster shot the next year. G. S. 67-33 requires that every dog at all times be required to wear a collar with the owner's name and address stamped on or otherwise firmly attached to the collar.

The taxing authorities have furnished you with a numbered metal tag for each dog listed for the year 1962—

Please Have this Tag Attached to Collar When Dog is Vaccinated

When your dog is vaccinated, be sure to get a receipt and a vaccination tag. Beginning May 1, 1962, all dogs not vaccinated and listed for taxes will be picked up and impounded. Owners can retrieve their impounded dogs within five days by paying the cost, taxes and by having the dog vaccinated. **THIS LAW WILL BE ENFORCED!** Save yourself extra cost by cooperating with the Rabies Control Law.

The Charge Will be \$1.50 for Each Dog Vaccinated.
