5 MORE THAN LAST QUARTER

33 Students Listed on Honor Roll  
At E. Southern Pines High School

Glenn L. Cox, principal of the East Southern Pines High School, announced today that 33 students exhibited sufficient proficiency in their work to be listed on the Honor Roll for the 3rd Quarter grading period. To be included in this group a student must receive no grade below a "B" on his report card.

Three students—Janet Phillips, Charles McLaughlin and Dianne Fields—earned all "A's" for the quarter's work. This means that they have an average of at least 95 per cent in each of their subjects.

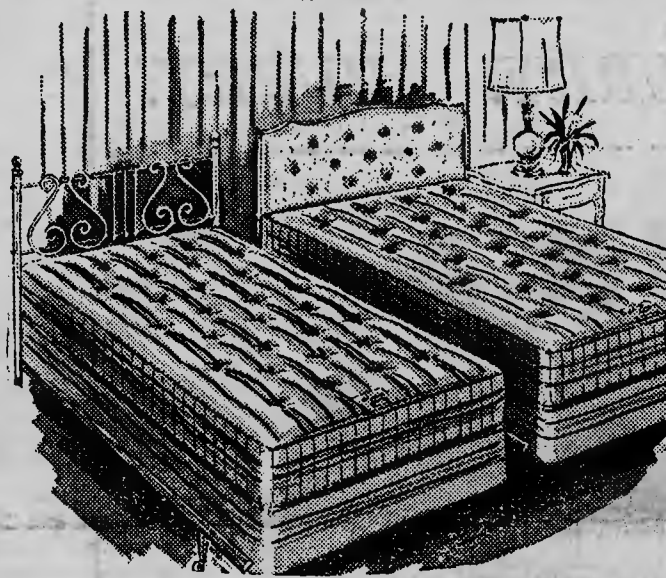

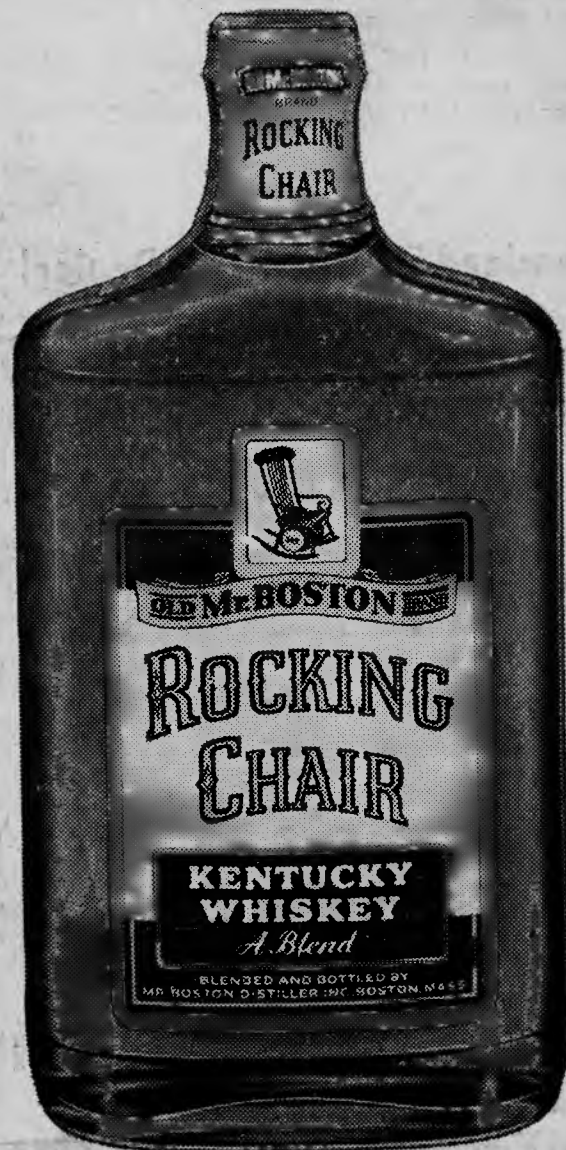
