### Gen. Mark Clark Will Address **Bankers Friday**

The 66th annual convention of the N. C. Bankers Association begins at the Carolina Hotel today and runs through Saturday evening with over 1,000 bankers and guests expected.

NCBA President C. M. (Neil Vanstory, Jr., of Greensboro will preside over the three-day convention which will feature addresses by General Mark W. Clark, president of The Citadel, and William F. Kelly, prominent Philadelphia banking executive. The convention begins Thurs-

day afternoon with registration and a president's reception. The general business sessions will be held on Friday and Saturday mornings. General Clark speaks on Friday and Kelly on Saturday. Entertainment on Friday evening will be by Shearen Elebash of Montgomery, Ala.

There will be a luncheon and bridge for the ladies-golf, skeet and bank parties between business sessions. Committees of the NCBA will make their reports, and the executive committee meetings will be held on Friday and Saturday mornings.

The NCBA organized at Morehead City and chartered in 1897, for the past several years has met at Pinehurst.
