**No Losses Shown  
On Farmers Home  
Loans in State**

Melvin H. Hearn, state director of the Farmers Home Administration for North Carolina, said today that during the 12-year operation of the Farmers Home Administration's rural housing loan program in North Carolina there have been no losses on these loans. The statement was based on the status of all loans obligated up to last December 31.

More than \$16,700,000 has been advanced in rural housing loans in North Carolina, Mr. Hearn said, and principal and interest payments totaled about \$5,800,000. Of the 16.7 million in loans, not one dollar has been written off as uncollectible.
