For sheer imagination, you can't beat a combination like Walt Disney and Jules Verne.

For fast-moving entertainment, you can't beat Disney's version of the late French author's adventure story, IN SEARCH OF THE CASTAWAYS, opening Saturday, January 5, to run through Wednesday, January 9, at the Sunrise Theatre.

The Burbank producer wisely chose talented English teenager Hayley Mills and venerable French charmer Maurice Chevalier to lead a bold band of adventurers across two continents in search of a shipwrecked sea captain. The talented twosome fit together like champagne and caviar; one effervescent, the other mellow.

Disney puts his top performers through a whirlwind, globe-girdling obstacle course; the adventurers encounter an earthquake, an avalanche, a volcano, a giant condor, a man-eating jaguar, a swarm of alligators, a mammoth waterspout, a flash flood, blood-thirsty mutineers and Ifoori cannibals.

George Sanders is at his suave, sophisticated best as double-dealing mutineer Thomas Ayerton, and Wilfrid Hyde White epitomizes the aloof English peer as Lord Edward Glenarvan.

Walt Disney produced IN SEARCH OF THE CASTAWAYS with the same light touch—a tongue-in-cheek mingling of comedy and suspense in the action sequences—that made his "The Swiss Family Robinson" such a delightful boxoffice success. The film is a Buena Vista release.

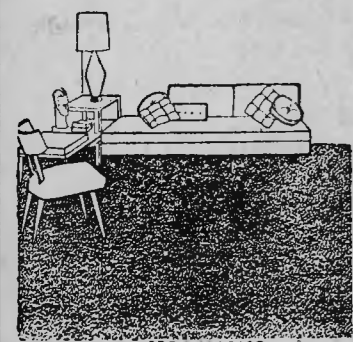

## Short Session Held Monday By Moore County Recorder's Court, Carthage

With patrolmen still on holiday saturation duty, citing most of their cases to January terms, only a brief docket faced Moore County Recorder's Court Monday at Carthage, in its first term since December 17.

The following cases were disposed of in the two-hour session: Bonnie Wallace Hall, Carthage, speeding 70 in 55-mile zone, \$15 and costs; Lloyd Douglas, Cameron, Route 1, worthless check, judgment continued on payment of \$15 and costs, also of the worthless check for \$69.50; John

Laster Spinks, Carthage, improper license plates, no liability insurance, 90 days suspended on payment of \$25 and costs, not to operate his car on highways till he first complies with all legal requirements; Rufus Allen Pridgen, Cameron, speeding 70 in 55-mile zone, judgment continued on payment of \$25 and costs, and on the further condition that defendant comply with restrictions as set forth in his license and in all respects obey the traffic laws; James A. Hamilton, Aiken, S. C., speeding 65 in 55-mile zone, judgment continued on payment of \$10 and costs; James Tyson, Carthage, failure to comply, 90 days suspended on payment of \$100 fine and costs, totaling \$139.25; Roy Allen Norris, Sanford, speeding 55 in 45-mile zone, \$10 and costs.
